- A regional scale identification and assessment of :
 - Segregated Areas and Areas of Increasing Diversity and Racial/Ethnic Integration
 - Racially and Ethnically Concentrated Areas of Poverty
 - Access to Existing Areas of High Opportunity
 - Major Public Investment
 - > Fair Housing Issues, Services, Activities
- to gain a picture of regional equity and access to opportunity



Once identified then what?

- Identify Indicators and Measurements to understand the geography of opportunity – examples:
 - Housing Affordability
 - Poverty and Income
 - Transit Access
 - > Job Access
 - School Proficiency
 - Neighborhood Quality/Quality of Life
- Engage Regional Partners around FHEA findings

Why are we doing a Fair Housing and Equity Assessment?
