MOTION:

That the TAB adopt an amendment to the 2011-2014 TIP to include Hennepin County SP#027-610-031: bituminous mill and overlay in various locations; SP#027-752-025: deck reconditioning, pedestrian enhancements and provisions for LRT station access on Cedar Avenue bridge #27030 over Washington Avenue in Minneapolis; SP#027-617-028: concrete pavement repair on France Avenue from TH 62 to I-494; SP#027-030-024: pedestrian and ramp retrofits in various location in north Minneapolis; and SP#027-030-023: pedestrian and ramp retrofits

along CSAH 23, CSAH 36.

BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE OF ACTION: Since Minnesota received extra federal funds because no new transportation act has been passed and no high priority projects (HPP) were added, the TAB elected to distribute available formula funds to all seven counties using the 2010 State Aid allocation. Each county has selected projects that can be delivered in Fiscal Year 2011 that have no right-of-way impacts or require environmental review. These projects satisfy these requirements.
