### PROJECT BACKGROUND:

1. Briefly describe why amendment is needed (e.g., project in previous TIP but not completed; illustrative project and funds now available; discretionary funds received; inadvertently not included in STIP).

The amendment is needed to identify project 164-030-009 in SFY 2011 of the 2011-2014 TIP that was awarded \$250,000 federal funds through the U.S. Department of Transportation TIGER II Discretionary Grant Program. The TIGER II Discretionary Grants Program was created for national infrastructure investments under the FY 2010 Appropriations Act. The City of Saint Paul applied for a TIGER II Planning Grant which was awarded on a competitive basis. Saint Paul was awarded its grant October 21, 2010.

The TIGER II Planning Grant will fund planning activities supporting a citywide complete streets policy, including design guidelines, needs assessment, project prioritization, and implementation action plan. This will provide clear guidelines for street designs that balance the needs of pedestrians, cyclists, transit, automobiles, and freight, and prioritized projects for implementation. One of the goals of the process is to create a complete streets model that can be replicated elsewhere in the metro area and Minnesota.

The complete streets planning process will have three major initiatives:

- o A citywide streets assessment,
- o Street design manual, and
- O A complete streets action plan.

#### Citywide Streets Assessment Report

The citywide streets assessment will include an analysis of transportation network and a review of street design processes. The transportation network analysis will identify service gaps, pinch points, where many transportation types are vying for limited space, and safety hotspots, and specific locations where there is an identified safety problem. The goal of the analysis is to provide criteria for necessary and vital improvements to transportation mode networks. This will be used to illustrate how future projects fit into the overall transportation needs of the City.

#### Street Design Manual

The street design manual will build on the citywide assessment to establish citywide street typology design standards. The guidebook will illustrate approved street design possibilities, explain positive and negative impacts of the design on all potential modes of transportation, and show how street design elements can be used together to create a complete streets design.

#### Complete Streets Action Plan

The focus of the complete streets action plan will be a prioritized list of projects based on need. Projects will be identified through the citywide assessment, community workshops, and staff interviews. The list will define criteria used to rank the projects, a rating in terms of the scale of the project, and a map identifying the location of the projects. The action plan will identify between one and ten pilot projects as a first phase to implement the complete streets plan.
