SUBJECT: 2011 Regional Solicitation: Summary of Applications Qualified for Scoring.

The TAC Funding & Programming Committee met on Thursday, December 15 and discussed issues and questions raised by staff about the qualifying criteria responses from 17 applications. Applicants were informed of the staff comments and were invited to the meeting to discuss their application with the committee and answer questions to resolve the issues. The committee voted to disqualify four applications and directed another applicant to choose between two projects with overlapping scopes. Staff was recently notified by an applicant to remove a project from the solicitation that had passed the qualifying review. Below is the tally of the applications by category that passed the qualifying criteria review and will be scored in the regional solicitation. This table does not include \$7M in CMAQ funds for travel demand management activities.
