Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council concur with the Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) action to amend the 2009-2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include the following five projects to be funded through the Economic Recovery and Reinvestment Program (ERRP).

- SP# 8214-142; TH 5 reconstruction in Oakdale, Lake Elmo, Baytown Twp. and Oak Park Heights.
- SP# 2733-86; TH 100 rebuild lighting system from I-494 to Vernon Ave. in Edina.
- SP# 1981-122; I-35W rebuild lighting system from Cliff Rd. in Burnsville to 106th St. in Bloomington.
- SP# 2780-84; I-94 Fish Lake interchange living snow fence in Maple Grove.
- SP# 2780-83; I-94 rebuild cable median barrier from Fish Lake interchange in Maple Grove to Hennepin/Wright County line

Background

In order to quickly create Minnesota jobs, MnDOT is requesting five new projects be added to the 2009-2012 TIP.

Rationale

In order to use ERRP funds, the projects must be in the current TIP. There are significant deadlines in the ERRP. MnDOT has requested the Council move quickly to advance these projects.

Funding

The ERRP is providing 100% funding for eligible transportation projects.

Known Support / Opposition

MnDOT presented these projects at the TAC February 13, 2009, Special Meeting, and they were approved by the TAB on February 18, 2009. No opposition was expressed.

MOTION: The Transportation Advisory Board amended the 2009-2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include the following five projects to be funded through the Economic Recovery and Reinvestment Program:

- SP# 8214-142; TH 5 reconstruction in Oakdale, Lake Elmo, Baytown Twp. and Oak Park Heights.
- SP# 2733-86; TH 100 rebuild lighting system from I-494 to Vernon Ave. in Edina.
- SP# 1981-122; I-35W rebuild lighting system from Cliff Rd. in Eagan to 106th St. in Burnsville.
- SP# 2780-84; I-94 Fish Lake interchange living snow fence landscaping in Maple Grove.
- SP# 2780-83; 194 rebuild cable median barrier from Fish Lake interchange in Maple Grove to Hennepin/Wright County line.

BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE OF ACTION: These five projects are the first ones in the Metro District to be funded through the Economic Recovery and Reinvestment Program (ERRP). These five projects will be funded 100% with federal ERRP funds from the state's (MN/DOT) allocation. None of the projects listed above are in the TIP and they must be amended into the Program to use federal funds. All five of these projects have anticipated letting dates in March and April, 2009.

Also attached is a spreadsheet listing two projects that were already programmed in the 2009-2012 STIP that will be advanced to a 2009 letting from the original program year using economic recovery funding. These projects were amended by MN/DOT through an administrative modification. Additional background material is attached.

Dear Mr. Mayasich:

Please amend the Twin Cities 2009 – 2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include the 2009 projects on the attached list. The projects are being submitted in anticipation of the enactment of the Economic Recovery Bill next week. The projects on the attached list are ready for a March 27thth and April 10th let dates and as such must be advertised by March 2nd and 16th. We request approval of this amendment in an expedited manner to meet the advertisement deadline.

PROJECT BACKGROUND:

- 1. Briefly describe why amendment is needed (e.g., project in previous STIP but not completed; illustrative project and funds now available; discretionary funds received; inadvertently not included in STIP).
 - An Economic Recovery Bill is under consideration by Congress in an effort to respond to increasingly dire economic conditions. Infrastructure is expected to be a significant emphasis in any bill passed .All reports out of Washington indicate that the Economic Recovery Package will have an aggressive schedule for implementation. This made it extremely important for states to do some preliminary vetting of projects that would meet possible requirements of the bill.

The projects in the attached list have been deemed most likely to meet the requirements of an Economic Recovery Program. Criteria to develop the list included:

- Job Creation should be the overriding objective for project selection
- Project "readiness" for authorization or contract letting as well as project deliverability should be given priority
- Projects already in the out years of the STIP/TIP where project development is complete or near completion should be considered for advancement
- Project timing should be considered so as to spread the demand for labor, equipment, and capital resources over the entire eligibility period and ultimately keep material and labor costs in check
- Projects meeting various bill requirements, e.g. state, local, MPO, small urban, etc.
- 2. How is Fiscal Constraint Maintained as required by 23 CFR 450.216?
 - These projects will be funded through the Federal Economic Recovery Package. Based on the funding information coming out of Congress, Mn/DOT has assumed a doubling of the 2008 program or approximately \$525 million. The total amount assumed for the Twin Cities Metro Area is approximately \$289 million. The breakdown of funds is shown below:

MnDOT(50% of State Discretionary) \$155Million Met Council (STP Urban Guarantee) \$109 Million Met Council (CMAQ – 90%) \$ 25 Million

• The projects in this amendment are the first to tap this funding and equal \$ (Formal Amendment total = \$8.693m; Administrative Modifications = \$9.095m). If a Federal Economic Recovery Package is not passed this fiscal year, Metro District will pursue these projects in the previously planned timeframes, as funding allowed.
