Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council concur with Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) action to amend the 2009-2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include projects as shown on attached tables that will be funded with MnDOT ARRA funding.

Background

MnDOT has initiated and the TAB has passed two previous TIP Amendments adding projects funded with ARRA funds. This amendment adds \$38.4 million for 14 projects and removes \$5.8 million from the first two TIP Amendments by removing seven projects and adjusting the costs of two projects previously included as part of the first two amendments, as shown in the attached tables. With this amendment, MnDOT Metro District will have allocated \$179.1 million in ARRA funds.

MnDOT is removing some projects in response to recent funding adjustments. After receiving reductions to state funding for 2010 and 2011, MnDOT re-evaluated its ARRA projects to best manage the base program and advance construction projects for economic stimulus as well.

Rationale

In order to spend federal funds, the projects must be in the current TIP.

Funding

The fiscal balance of the TIP is maintained due to the addition of new ARRA funds.

Known Support / Opposition

There was no opposition presented at the TAC or the TAB.

Mr. Bell,

On May 20, 2009, the Transportation Advisory Board voted to amend the 2009-2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to allocate the remaining ARRA funds available to the MN/DOT Metro District. This amendment includes the following:

- A table showing the re-allocation of approximately \$5.8 million in State ARRA funds previously allocated by MN/DOT;
- A table showing seven projects to be amended into the TIP and STIP, using approximately \$4.7 million in State ARRA funds; and
- A table showing seven projects, already in the STIP, that will be administratively modified to include approximately \$32.3 million in State ARRA funds.

The TAB forwards this action to the Metropolitan Council for concurrence along with additional information described in TAB action transmittal 2009-35.

BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE OF ACTION: This amendment is the third amendment for Mn/DOT ARRA funding. It adds \$38.4 million in projects, while removing \$5.8 million in projects previously included as part of Amendment 2 and Amendment 1. Along with the other two amendments, MnDOT's share in regional ARRA projects, projects in Chisago County (outside the seven-county MPO area), and Metro District participation in local projects, the Metro District program total is \$179.1 million.

Please amend the 2009 – 2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include these projects in 2010. The projects are being submitted with the following information:

PROJECT IDENTIFICATION:

See Attached Tables.

PROJECT BACKGROUND:

1. Briefly describe why amendment is needed (e.g., project in previous STIP but not completed; illustrative project and funds now available; discretionary funds received; inadvertently not included in STIP).

President Obama signed the \$787 billion American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) into law on Tuesday, February 17, 2009. This bill included increased funding for infrastructure across the country. Minnesota is expected to receive approximately \$500 million for highway projects. One provision of the bill requires 50% of the state discretionary funds be authorized within 120 days.

The projects in the attached list meet the requirements of this Economic Recovery Program and advance projects to meet these deadlines. It also positions the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area well for redistributed funds, should they become available. The projects are also consistent with the guiding principles as developed by both MnDOT and the Metropolitan Council. Criteria used to develop the list included:

- Job Creation should be the overriding objective for project selection
- Project "readiness" for authorization or contract letting as well as project deliverability should be given priority
- Consistency with performance based plans; projects of value to region or state.
- Projects already in the out years of the STIP/TIP where project development is complete or near completion should be considered for advancement

- Project timing should be considered so as to spread the demand for labor, equipment, and capital resources over the entire eligibility period and ultimately keep material and labor costs in check.
- Work type balance

According to rates from the U.S. DOT, the projects in this amendment are expected to create approximately 1,038 jobs (27 jobs per million construction dollars).

This proposed TIP amendment is the third amendment for MnDOT ARRA funding. It adds \$38.4 million in projects, while removing \$5.8 million in projects previously included as part of Amendment 2 and Amendment 1. With the other two amendments, MnDOT's share in regional ARRA projects, projects in Chisago County (outside the seven-county MPO area), Metro District participation in local projects, the Metro District program total is \$ 179.1M.

- How is Fiscal Constraint Maintained as required by 23 CFR 450.216?
 - These projects will be funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.
 Based on the our current understanding of the funding contained within the bill,
 Minnesota will receive approximately \$502 million for highway funding. The total
 amount assumed for the Twin Cities Metro Area is approximately \$250 million. The
 breakdown of funds is shown below:

MnDOT(50% of State Discretionary) \$168 Million
Met Council (STP Urban Guarantee) \$ 74 Million
Enhancements \$ 8 Million

- Over the past 2 months MnDOT has presented two TIP amendments to identify
 projects that will be utilizing funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment
 Act.
 - ✓ Amendment 1 identified \$17,788,750 of projects approved by the Metropolitan Council on February 25, 2009.
 - ✓ Amendment 2 identified \$125,650,000 of projects approved by the Metropolitan Council on April 22, 2009. A Technical correction was approved on April 22, 2009 that identified \$103,750,600 ARRA funds needed.
- After receiving STIP guidance on reductions to the state fund portion of the 2010-11 construction budget, MnDOT Metro District re-evaluated its ARRA projects to best manage the base program and advance construction projects for economic stimulus as well. Based on that analysis, some projects were removed from the original list and additional projects were identified to complete the MnDOT Metro ARRA list. A determination was made that 6 projects totaling \$5,786,200, previously submitted in Amendment 2 and Amendment 1, would be eliminated (See attached sheet with strike outs identified)
- The projects in Amendment 3 equals \$38,444,330 (Formal Amendment total = \$4,740,100; Administrative Modifications = \$33,704,200).
