Proposed Action

Background

In November 2008, MnDOT applied for Value Pricing Program demonstration funding from FHWA for the I-94 and TH 77 corridors to study and test a number of managed lane scenarios to provide a higher level of service for all users. The state was recently selected to receive these federal funds and an amendment is needed to identify them in SFY 2010 of the current TIP so the studies may proceed.

PROJECT BACKGROUND:

1. Briefly describe why amendment is needed (e.g., project in previous STIP but not completed; illustrative project and funds now available; discretionary funds received; inadvertently not included in STIP).

In November 2008, MnDOT applied for Value Pricing Program (VPP) demonstration funding from FHWA for the I94 corridor and TH 77 corridors to study and test a number of managed lanes scenarios to provide a higher level of service for all users. The award of both VPP grants, along with the pending opening of MnPASS on I-35W, these studies will analyze the region-wide opportunities for MnPASS and the connections to I-94, TH 77, I-394, and I-35W.

The goal for the study on TH 77 is to achieve greater efficiency in the corridor through better utilization of existing infrastructure. On I-94, there are several goals any recommendation from the study would need to achieve, such as:

- 1) Better utilize existing infrastructure investments
- 2) Preserve or enhance advantages for transit and carpoolers
- 3) Preserve or enhance advantages for general traffic
- 4) Provide a congestion free choice for single occupant drivers; and
- 5) Preserve and enhance corridor safety

Minnesota was recently selected to receive these federal funds and this amendment is needed to identify them in SFY 2010 of the current 2009-2012 TIP so the studies may proceed.
