# **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council Concur with Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) action to amend the 2009-2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include five projects that have received 2009 appropriation funds.

# **Background**

Annually, Congress approves an Appropriation Bill that includes funds for specific projects. The five projects that received funding are:

- Lowry Ave. Bridge Replacement in Minneapolis
- Snelling Ave. Pedestrian Median in St. Paul
- TH 65 Pedestrian Bridge Replacement at 49<sup>th</sup> Ave. in Columbia Heights, right-of-way acquisition
- TH 65 Pedestrian Bridge Replacement at 49<sup>th</sup> Ave. in Columbia Heights, preliminary engineering
- I-35W N. Congestion Mitigation and Design.
