Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute a Purchase and Sale Agreement for a Ramsey Station Easement with Burlington Northern Railway Company (BNSF) in a not-to-exceed amount of \$3,400,000; and

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute a Platform Agreement and an Overpass Agreement with BNSF for the Ramsey station; and

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute amendments to the Joint Use Agreement and the Commuter Service Agreement with BNSF.

Background

Northstar operates commuter rail service from Big Lake, MN to Minneapolis "Northstar Corridor" under easement agreements with BNSF. The easement agreements along with our Joint Use and Commuter Service Agreements with BNSF allow Northstar to provide commuter rail service along the Northstar Corridor serving Big Lake, Elk River, Anoka, Coon Rapids, Fridley and Target Field stations.

Rationale

The purchase of additional easement rights and amendments to the Joint Use and Commuter Service Agreements are required to provide service to a station at the City of Ramsey.

Additionally, a Platform Agreement and an Overpass Agreement with BNSF are required to construct and operate the two platforms located on BNSF right-of-way and a pedestrian overpass serving the platforms.

Funding

The project is funded through financial contributions from the State of Minnesota (State G.O. Bonds), the Metropolitan Council, the Anoka County Regional Rail Authority, the City of Ramsey and the Counties Transit Improvement Board.
