





Engineering Services Consultant Contract Procurement Process

- Follows Federal Brooks Act procurement procedure
 - Qualifications-based competitive process
 - Consistent with FTA & Council practices for professional engineering services procurements
 - Requires specific steps to evaluate proposals



Engineering Services Consultant Contract Procurement Process – Steps

- Evaluate technical proposals 3 criteria
 - Quality of proposal
 - Qualifications of proposer
 - Experience of proposer
- Identify most qualified proposer
- Open price proposal
- Conduct negotiations



Engineering Services Consultant Contract Procurement Process – Evaluation Panel

- Consists of six members
 - Southwest Project Office (2)
 - Light Rail Operations
 - MnDOT
 - Hennepin County
 - Community Works
- Identifies most qualified proposer
- Provides recommendation to the Council



Engineering Services Consultant Contract Procurement Process – Technical Advisory Group

- Consists of nine members
 - Southwest Project Office
 - Light Rail Operations
 - Metropolitan Transportation Services
 - MnDOT
 - City of Hopkins
 - City of Minneapolis
 - City of Minnetonka
 - City of St. Louis Park
 - Three Rivers Park District
- Provides technical review and input



Engineering Services Consultant Contract Evaluation Panel concluded:

- URS Team most qualified proposer
 - Senior Project Manager/Design Manager selected best fits for key positions
 - Proposal identified creative solutions to key project issues
- URS Team is most advantageous to assist the Council in successfully advancing the Project

Engineering Services Consultant Contract Procurement Process – Responsibility Review

- Met Council hired independent third-party legal firm, Hammargren & Meyer, P.A.
- Investigated & assessed responsibility of most qualified proposer (URS)
- Concluded there is insufficient grounds upon which the Council can find URS non-responsible



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
Engineering Services Consultant Contract Bridge design approach

- Bridge designs will be conducted by 3 separate teams
 - URS
 - Parsons Brinkerhoff
 - TKDA
- Design review and oversight by MnDOT bridge engineer
- Independent design review by 3rd party consultant hired by the Council



Engineering Services Consultant Contract 5 Separate Notices-To-Proceed

- ★ Develop work plan and initiate Engineering
- ★ Complete 30% Engineering
- Complete Advanced Engineering
- Complete Final Design
- Provide Design Services during Construction





Funding for Engineering Services Contract Consultant Activities

Funding Available \$47,062,000

Planned Expenditures

Initial Engineering \$2,500,000Activities

- Complete 30% \$25,000,000

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Recommended Actions

Authorize the Regional Administrator to:

- Negotiate & execute a contract with URS for Engineering Services for SWLRT
 - Not to exceed \$94 million
 - Council may terminate contract at any time
- Issue 2 limited NTPs to initiate Engineering activities and complete 30% Engineering
 - Not to exceed \$27.5 million
- Authorize amendments to Contract
 - Up to \$500,000 individual
 - Up to \$5 million cumulative
