## Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council consider reimbursing Dakota County in future regional parks capital improvement programs up to \$2,325,665 for projects shown in Table 1. However, the Council does not under any circumstances represent or guarantee that reimbursement will be granted, and expenditure of local funds never entitles a park agency to reimbursement.

## Background

Dakota County has asked the Metropolitan Council to consider reimbursing the County in future regional parks capital improvement programs up to \$2,325,665 for the following capital projects:

\$2,100,665 as a match to a \$3,395,909 of federal Transportation Enhancement grants to develop portions of the Mississippi River Regional Trail (MRRT) in Dakota County;

\$125,000 for signage in Dakota County’s regional parks and trails

\$100,000 for landscaping, ecological improvements and signage at Schaar’s Bluff Visitor Center in Spring Lake Park Reserve

Strategy 2(f) of the *2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan* states:

### Strategy 2(f): Reimbursement

Reimbursement will be considered for development provided the project in question is consistent in timing, scale, type and cost with an approved master plan, that all information required for a development grant is submitted to the Council prior to the regional park implementing agency undertaking the project and that the Council approves the project.

## Funding

The following table provides details for the County's CIP reimbursement consideration request.

At this time there are about \$46 million of projects that the Metropolitan Council has approved for regional parks CIP reimbursement consideration. Such approval only allows the applicable regional park agency to seek

reimbursement funding for such projects as part of that agency's share of future regional parks capital improvement programs. The Metropolitan Council does not under any circumstances represent or guarantee that reimbursement will be granted, and expenditure of local funds never entitles a park agency to reimbursement.

### **Known Support / Opposition**

The Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission (MPOSC) considered the County's request for reimbursement consideration on May 18. The MPOSC found the request was consistent with the requirements of *2030 Park Policy Plan Strategy 2(f)* and unanimously approved the recommendation.

There is no known opposition to this request.

**Introduction**

Dakota County has asked the Metropolitan Council to consider reimbursing the County in future regional parks capital improvement programs up to \$2,325,665 for the following capital projects:

\$2,100,665 as a match to a \$3,395,909 of federal Transportation Enhancement grants to develop portions of the Mississippi River Regional Trail in Dakota County;

\$125,000 for signage in Dakota County's regional parks and trails

\$100,000 for landscaping, ecological improvements and signage at Schaar's Bluff Visitor Center in Spring Lake Park Reserve

This memorandum contains a review of the request for reimbursement consideration under applicable terms in Strategy 2(f) of the *2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan*.

**Authority to review**

Minnesota Statute Section 473.315 authorizes the "Metropolitan Council with the advice of the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission to make grants from any funds available to it for recreation open space purposes to any municipality, park district or county located wholly or partially within the metropolitan area to cover the cost, or any portion of the cost, of acquiring or developing regional recreation open space in accordance with the [*Regional Recreation Open Space*] *Policy Plan*".

**Background**

In 1999, the Metropolitan Council approved the development master plan for the Mississippi River Regional Trail between the cities of South St. Paul and Hastings. On January 25, 2009 the Metropolitan Council approved a master plan amendment which changed the trail's alignment for the section between Hastings and Spring Lake Park Reserve (Referral No. 15553-5). The amended alignment parallels Co. Rd. 42 out of Hastings and then moves northwesterly along Co. Rd. 87 and 125<sup>th</sup> Street into Spring Lake Park Reserve. This segment is described as MRRT – East in the Dakota County letter (**Attachment 1**). The MRRT and specific segments proposed for reimbursement are shown in **Figure 1: Mississippi River Regional Trail—Dakota County**

The Metropolitan Council approved an updated master plan for Spring Lake Park Reserve in April 2004. That plan included the development of the Schaar’s Bluff Gathering Center. The center has been built. The County’s

request is for CIP reimbursement consideration for landscaping, ecological improvements and other site amenities it intends to do later this year.

Strategy 2(f) of the *2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan* states:

**Strategy 2(f): Reimbursement**

Reimbursement will be considered for development provided the project in question is consistent in timing, scale, type and cost with an approved master plan, that all information required for a development grant is submitted to the Council prior to the regional park implementing agency undertaking the project and that the Council approves the project.

These projects are consistent with the terms of Strategy 2(f) for the following reasons:

1. The timing, scale and cost of this project are consistent with the Council-approved development master plan under the following factors:
  - a. The timing, scale and cost of the projects are consistent with the development master plans for the following trail and park projects:

Mississippi River Regional Trail (MRRT) master plan initially approved in 1999 with an amendment to the plan regarding the MRRT East segment approved January 28, 2009

Spring Lake Park Reserve master plan update approved in April 2004 for the Schaar’s Bluff Gathering Center project.
  - b. Enough information has been submitted in this request regarding what would be financed with a Council grant to meet the requirements of Strategy 2(f). In this case, that information is contained in **Attachment 1**.
  - c. Dakota County is requesting Metropolitan Council approval for these projects prior to undertaking them.

**Status of reimbursement consideration requests**

At this time there are about \$46 million of projects that the Metropolitan Council has approved for regional parks CIP reimbursement consideration. Such approval only allows the applicable regional park agency to seek reimbursement funding for such projects as part of that agency’s share of future regional parks capital improvement programs. Table 2 at the end of this memorandum lists all projects that may be considered for reimbursement in future regional parks capital improvement programs.

**Conclusion**

The *2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan* requires that requests for CIP reimbursement consideration are consistent with the terms of Strategy 2(f). This review concludes that Dakota County’s request for reimbursement consideration of up to \$2,325,665 for projects shown in Table 1 is consistent with the terms of Strategy 2(f). The timing of when Dakota County is reimbursed for any portion of the \$2,325,665 is dependent on when funds are provided in future regional parks capital improvement programs. However, the Council does not under any circumstances represent or guarantee that a reimbursement will be granted, and expenditure of local funds never entitles a park agency to reimbursement.

**Recommendation**

That the Metropolitan Council consider reimbursing Dakota County in future regional parks capital improvement programs up to \$2,325,665 for projects shown in Table 1. However, the Council does not under any circumstances represent or guarantee that reimbursement will be granted, and expenditure of local funds never entitles a park agency to reimbursement.

Dear Arne,

Dakota County (DC) requests Metropolitan Council consideration for eligibility for future reimbursement of County funds to be used for engineering and construction of eligible capital improvement projects.

Since early 2008 DC has advanced the planning of various segments of the Mississippi River Regional Trail (MRRT) and is now getting closer to final engineering and acquisition of needed right-of-way and construction. Therefore, eligibility for reimbursement of County funds for the MRRT project is requested for:

#### MRRT North: South St. Paul into Inver Grove Heights (70<sup>th</sup> Street) Segment

- DC has received a federal transportation grant for acquisition and construction in the amount of \$837,264, and has budgeted \$550,000 of county funds as grant match and for other related costs. Construction is scheduled for late 2009 or early 2010.

#### MRRT Central: Cahill Avenue to Pine Bend SNA Segment

- DC has received a federal transportation grant for acquisition and construction in the amount of \$772,800, and has budgeted \$150,000 of county funds as grant match and for other related costs. Construction is scheduled for late 2009 or early 2010.

#### MRRT Pine Bend: Pine Bend SNA Vicinity to 117<sup>th</sup> Street Segment

- DC has budgeted \$125,000 of county funds for final engineering of this trail segment. Construction is scheduled for 2010 or 2011 assisted by a federal transportation grant of \$943,312, matched by \$550,665 of county funds. A portion of this local match has been requested via the Parks and Trails Fund

2009/2010 appropriation. If any of those funds are received the amount will be deducted from the Met Council reimbursement request.

**MRRT East: Spring Lake Park Reserve to Hastings Segment**

- DC has received a federal transportation grant for acquisition and construction in the amount of \$842,533, and has budgeted \$325,000 of county funds as grant match and for other related costs. Construction is scheduled for late 2009 or early 2010.

**MRRT General Project Budget Assistance**

- All segments of the MRRT are likely to exceed original budget amounts and so the county has budgeted an additional \$400,000 of county funds to use for engineering, acquisition, construction and closely related expenses, as required for any MRRT project.

A MRRT route map is enclosed that identifies the location of the above segments.

Furthermore, DC seeks consideration for eligibility for future reimbursement of County funds for these capital projects:

**System-wide Sign Elements Plan Implementation**


- Signs include primary and secondary entrance type monument signs, as well as directional, regulatory, interpretive and other signs. County funds of \$125,000 have been budgeted for implementation in late 2009.

**Spring Lake Park Reserve – Schaar’s Bluff Gathering Center**

- DC has budgeted \$100,000 for site landscaping and ecological improvement, signs, and other amenities. Funds should be expended later this year.
