Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council:

Amend the 2011 Capital Budget (annual appropriation) by increasing it \$1,420,800 for the year 2011 and increasing the multi-year authorization by \$7,104,000 for Parks and Open Space;

Approve the projects under "Increasing Funding Commitments" as detailed in Attachment 1.

Background

The proposed capital program and budget amendment includes the following changes to the adopted Parks and Open Space capital program:

Increasing Funding Commitments:

On July 21, 2011 the appropriation bill from the Parks and Trails Legacy Fund was put into effect. [2011 First Special Session Laws, Chapter 6, Article 3, Section. 40]. This legislation appropriated \$15,763,000 to the Metropolitan Council for grants to regional park implementing agencies to support parks and trails of regional significance. On September 14, the Metropolitan Council authorized grants for 28 projects that total \$12,206,000 that are financed with the FY 2012 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation. This amendment includes a grant to Scott County of \$512,000 now that the County Board has approved its project proposed to be funded from this appropriation. The grant is shown in Attachment 1 under the heading "New Legislative Authorization FY 2012 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund Project Specific CIP".

On July 21, 2011 a capital investment (bonding) bill was put into effect. [2011 First Special Session Laws, Chapter 12, Sec. 14, Subd. 3]. This legislation appropriated \$5 million to the Metropolitan Council for grants to regional park agencies for projects that were consistent with the Council's regional parks policy plan's capital improvement program. The law also stated that priority must be given to land acquisition and rehabilitation projects. The Metropolitan Council has provided a \$2 match to \$3 of State bonds for these projects in past capital improvement programs and that is what

is proposed here. Consequently, \$3.334 million of the Metropolitan Council's park bonds are proposed to match the \$5 million State bond appropriation for a total of \$8.334 million.

This amendment includes grant authorizations for 13 projects that total \$6,592,000. They are depicted in Attachment 1 under the heading "New Legislative Authorization 2011 State bond appropriation and Metro Council bond match for Project Specific CIP" A grant to the Minneapolis Parks & Recreation Board of \$1,743,000 for Theodore Wirth Regional Park is not presented for approval at this time because the Park Board is currently updating the master plan for the park. The grant is intended to finance projects in the updated plan. Until the master plan has been completed and the Metropolitan Council has approved the master plan it is premature to authorize a grant for the park.

Change in Current Year Expenditures:

Based on projected expenditures for the proposed amendment in the remainder of 2011, the 2011 Capital Budget is proposed to be increased by \$1,420,800.

The Multi-Year Authorization is increased \$7,104,000 based on the addition of the new grants.

Rationale

This amendment to the 2011 Authorized Capital Program implements a portion of the State FY 2012 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation and 2011 State bonds and matching Metro Council bonds appropriated for specific projects.

Funding

This amendment is financed with a portion of the State FY 2012 Parks and Trails Fund appropriation, and a portion of the 2011 State bond appropriation with matching Metropolitan Council bonds as described above and in Attachment 1.

Known Support / Opposition

The regional park implementing agencies which receive these subgrants support this amendment. The grants are consistent with legislative and Metropolitan Council policies/requirements.
