Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council:

- 1. Adopt the attached review record and allow the City of Carver to put the 2011 System Statement comprehensive plan amendment (CPA) into effect.
- 2. Find that the proposed CPA does not change the City's forecasts.

Background

The Council reviewed Carver's Comprehensive Plan Update (2008-271, Review No. 20325-1) on December 10, 2008, and allowed the City to put it into effect. The City has submitted three comprehensive plan amendments (CPA) since the Council's review of the Update as described in the review record.

The proposed amendment is in response to the 2011 System Statement showing updates to the 2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan. The CPA proposes revisions to the Plan to include the two needed regional trail search corridors.

Rationale

The proposed CPA conforms to regional system plans, is consistent with Council policies, and is compatible with the plans of other local communities, school districts, and affected special districts.

There is no known opposition.

REVIEW RECORD

City of Carver Comprehensive Plan Amendment 2011 System Statement Amendment

BACKGROUND

The City of Carver (City) is located in eastern Carver County on the Minnesota River. The City is bordered by Chaska, Dahlgren and San Francisco Townships in Carver County, and Jackson and Louisville Townships in Scott County. The 2030 Regional Development Framework (RDF) identifies the City as a Rural Growth Center.

In 2010, the City had 700 residents, 250 households and 500 jobs. The Metropolitan Council (Council) forecasts the City to have 15,000 residents; 5,650 households; and 2,800 jobs in the year 2030.

The Council reviewed Carver's Comprehensive Plan Update (Review No. 20325-1) on December 10, 2008 and since then, the City submitted three plan amendments. The first (Review No. 20325-2) incorporated into the Plan an orderly annexation agreement for land intended for future urbanization in Dahlgren Township, in response to the Council's review of the Update. The Council acted on this amendment on May 26, 2010. The second (Review No. 20325-3) requested wastewater service and potable water to serve a Minnesota Department of Transportation truck station facility located in the City of Chaska through a joint powers agreement. The Council acted on this amendment on August 16, 2011.

REQUEST SUMMARY

In response to changes in the 2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan (RPPP), the CPA proposes to update maps and text in the comprehensive plan to acknowledge the Minnesota River Bluffs Regional Trail Extension Search Corridor and the Union Pacific Regional Trail Search Corridor identified in the RPPP.

The City's Plan now describes the Union Pacific Regional Trail as a planned regional trail for which the specific corridor has been determined and adopted in the Minnesota River Bluffs Extension and Scott County Connection Regional Trail Plan dated February 2011. The trail acquisition process began October 2011. The plan also identifies a search corridor for the Minnesota River Bluffs Regional Trail Extension that will connect from downtown Carver near the Union Pacific Regional Trail to the Minnesota Valley National Wildlife Refuge Visitors Center. It continues to the Minnesota River Bluffs and Ravines Regional Park Search Area. This trail will be planned by Carver County.

The CPA conforms to the Regional System Plans for Parks, Transportation (including Aviation), and Wastewater, with no substantial impact on, or departure from these plans.

Consistency with Council Policies

The CPA is consistent with the Council's RDF, with water resources management, and is consistent with Council forecasts.

Compatibility with Plans of Adjacent Jurisdictions

The CPA will not have an impact on adjacent communities, school districts, or watershed districts, and is compatible with the plans of those districts.

- The Council acted on the City's Update on December 10, 2008 (Review File No. 20325-1, Business Item 2008-271).
- The Council approved the Dahlgren Township OAA amendment on May 26, 2010 (Review File No. 20325-2, Business Item 2010-182).
- The MnDOT facility service expansion amendment was approved on August 16, 2011 (Review File No. 20325-3, administrative review).

ISSUE ANALYSIS AND FINDINGS

CONFORMANCE WITH REGIONAL SYSTEMS

REGIONAL PARKS

The CPA conforms to the 2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan. The CPA acknowledges the Minnesota River Bluffs Regional Trail Extension Search Corridor, and the Union Pacific Regional Trail Search Corridor. The CPA includes these in maps and text in the parks chapter of the comprehensive plan.

TRANSPORTATION

The CPA conforms to the 2030 Transportation Policy Plan. The CPA does not propose changes to the transportation element of the Plan.

CONSISTENCY WITH COUNCIL POLICY

The proposed CPA is consistent with the Council's policies for land use, housing, subsurface sewage treatment systems, and water supply. The proposed CPA is consistent with the 2030 Regional Development Framework (RDF) policies for Rural Growth Centers. The CPA will not change the City's forecasts.


