#### **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to enter into a grant agreement with Minnesota Valley Transit Authority for the purchase of six replacement buses in an amount not to exceed \$2,100,000.

## Background

## Rationale

MVTA will replace six Bluebird buses which have reached the end of their useful life per Federal Transit Administration regulations. This investment reflects the Council's commitment to maintain and preserve regional transit investments and is in alignment with the objectives of the unified capital programming process.

## Funding

The purchase of these replacement vehicles is an authorized project in the 2008 Capital Improvement Plan. These replacement vehicles are funded with Regional Transit Capital.
