

2008 Legislative Session Summary



Transportation Finance Bill

- Allows one-quarter percent metro sales tax.
- \$30.8 M first year for Metro
 Transit operating assistance.
- Joint Powers Board.
- GEARS committee.



Transportation Finance Bill

- Grants awarded after Metro Council review.
- Sales tax revenues only for transitway construction and operations.
- \$50 M Trunk highway bonds for transit advantages.



State Bonding

- \$70 M Central Corridor
- \$16.7 M − UPA
- ◆ \$4 M Cedar Ave. BRT
- \$10.5 M Regional parks capital improvement funding
- 10% state cap on LRT projects



Tax Bills

- \$33.6 M in 2008 and \$30 M in 2009 in regional bonding authorization for transit.
- Sales tax exemptions for Central Corridor (construction) and Northstar (vehicles and parts).



Supplemental Budget Bill

- GF appropriation for transit reduced \$136,000.
- GF appropriation for parks O&M reduced \$300,000 but replaced with lottery-in-lieu of sales tax funds.
- \$500,000 energy grant for algae research project with U of M.



Environmental Trust Fund Allocation Bill

 Provides \$1.5 M in lottery proceeds for regional park land acquisitions.



2007 Transportation Policy Bill

- Changes transit performance audit to peer group review.
- Modifies Metro Mobility language to conform to current ADA eligibility requirements.



2007 Transportation Policy Bill

- LRT governance change to allow MnDOT or Metro Council to design, build and construct LRT.
- Gives Metro Transit police more flexibility in working with other police agencies and ability to receive forfeited property funds.



Commuter Rail Governance

- Metro Council to operate and maintain commuter rail (in whole or part in the metro area).
- Stipulates transfer from MnDOT after construction.
- Metro Transit police authority for vehicles and stations.



UPA Enabling Legislation

- Authority to MnDOT to charge user fees for shoulder and HOV lane use by single occupant vehicles.
- Stipulates revenue disbursement from fees collected.
- Annual report by MnDOT on mitigating congestion on I-35W.



UPA Sidelight

 Negotiated with Lakeville to voluntarily join transit taxing district over interest in UPA project.



Environmental Services Policy Bill

- Includes wastewater biomass in definitions of renewable energy sources.
- Extends Drinking Water Supply Advisory Committee through December 2010 (two years).



2008 Transportation Policy Bill

- Through annual transit evaluation, Met Council must assess progress in meeting transit goals for disabled.
- Council website must include LRT information.



Other Legislation

- Constitutional amendment for environmental and arts programs (33% to clean water fund, 14.25% to state and regional parks).
- MnDOT to study impact of transit construction projects on small businesses (consult w/Council).



Did Not Happen

- Dan Patch.
- Staggered terms for Council appointments.
- Use of fiscal disparities in MOA expansion.
