Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to execute sub-recipient agreements with Minnesota Valley Transit Authority (MVTA) and Dakota County for state funds needed to deliver the five Cedar Avenue Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) stations as called for in the Urban Partnership Agreement (UPA).

Background

The UPA provides a comprehensive approach to congestion reduction that includes congestion pricing, transit improvements, telecommuting/telework, and the use of advanced technologies. Under the UPA program, the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) awarded a series of grants totaling \$133.3 million jointly to MnDOT and the Metropolitan Council including an FTA grant for \$85.9 million to fund transit improvements. With few exceptions, all elements of the UPA program must be complete by September 30, 2009.

As part of the UPA, the region committed to constructing five new advanced BRT stations along the TH 77 corridor and expanding park-and-ride spaces at one of these stations. Unlike the other UPA transit projects, the UPA provides only some of the funding necessary to complete these projects. The remaining funding has been previously appropriated by the Minnesota State Legislature in the form of state general obligation bonds from 2005, 2006 and 2008. These are the funds that are the subject of this request.

Metropolitan Council, as the grantee, is responsible for administration and management of the grant in compliance with the grant agreement. The grantee is also responsible for funds that "pass through" to a subrecipient. A subrecipient agreement with MVTA and Dakota County is necessary to codify each party's responsibilities and obligations to the other, thereby establishing the "pass through" mechanism.

Rationale

• Council approval is required to enter into interagency agreements, which includes sub-recipient agreements.

Funding

The table below identifies the 2005, 2006, and 2008 state general obligation bonds that have been appropriated for implementing BRT on Cedar Avenue.

Known Support / Opposition

USDOT selected the Minneapolis/St. Paul region as one of five urban partners in August 2007. The Minnesota State Legislature and the Governor approved all of the necessary local match and enabling legislation for the Urban Partnership Agreement by the federally mandated deadline of May 12, 2008.
