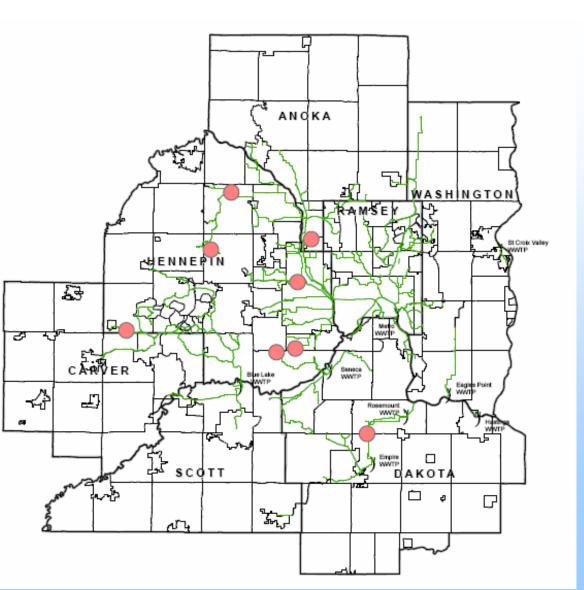

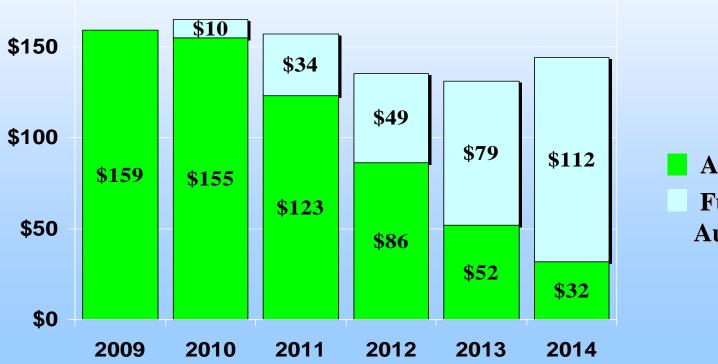

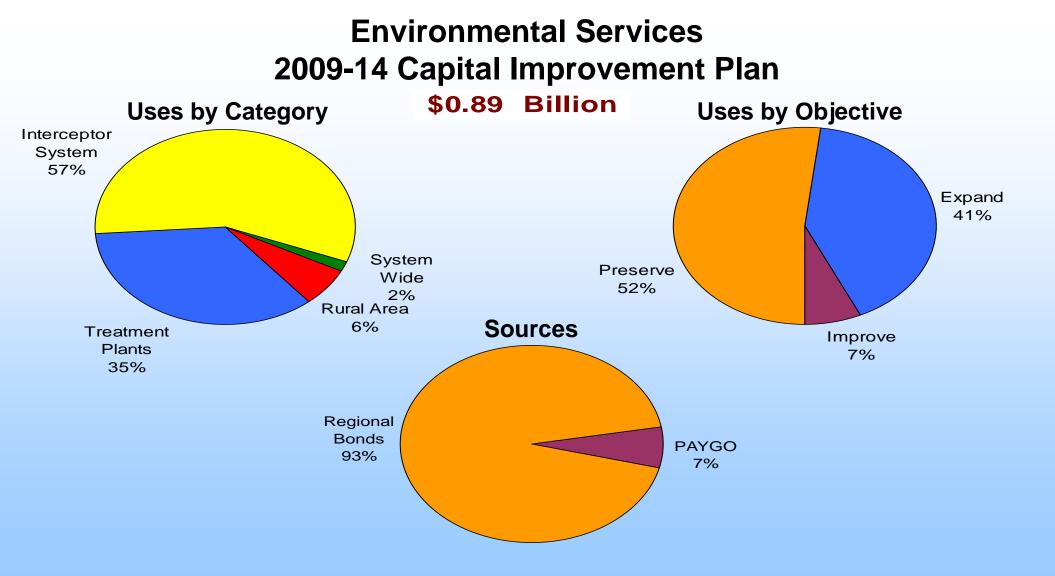
#### Expenditures by Year (\$ millions)

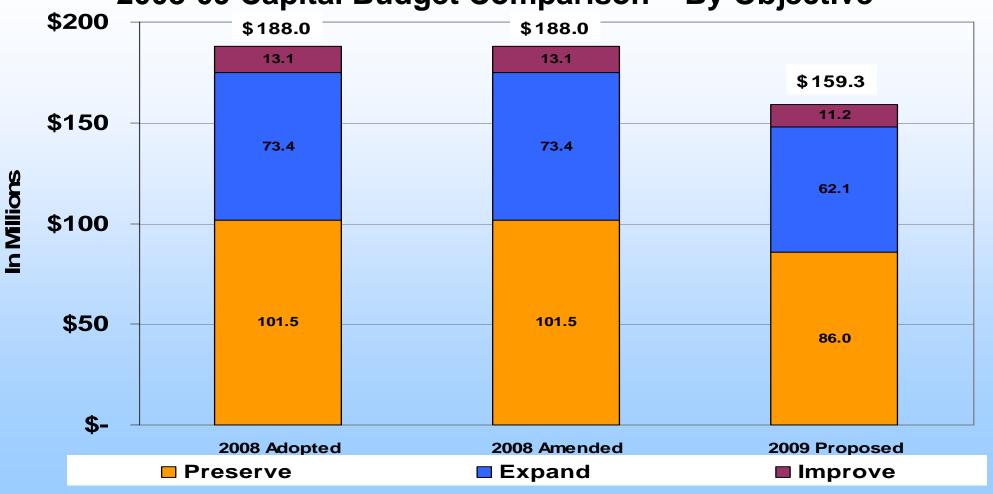




Authorized Future Authorization



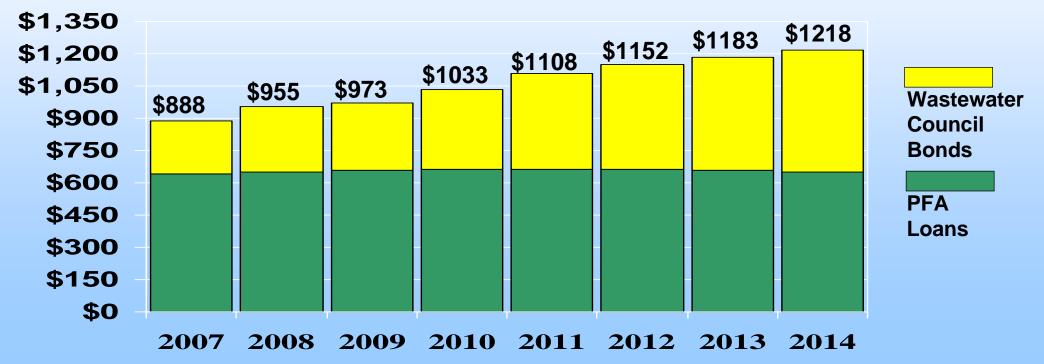
#### Environmental Services 2008-09 Capital Budget Comparison – By Objective

Expenses: Total Debt Service	\$90.7

# **Financial Trends**

### Municipal Wastewater Charges 2009: \$161.3 million 2010–2014 Forecast: 5–6% increase/year

### Service Availability Charges 2009: \$2,000 per home 2010–2014 Forecast: \$175/year increase (to be re-evaluated annually)
