

# **SFY 09 Transit Deficit Interventions**

#### Under Consideration:

- Administrative Efficiencies (\$2.45 M)
  Calendar 2008 Operating Surplus (\$1.7 M)
  Admin. Reductions / Route Adjustments (\$0.75 M)
- Draw Down of Reserves (\$8.4 M)
  - MT Rail (\$0.5 M)
  - MTS (\$2.0 M)
  - General Fund (\$4.7 M)

General Fund Appropriation Interest Earnings (\$0.6 M)

MVST Reserve Share of Forecast Reduction (\$0.6)

# **Administrative Interventions**

- Administrative Efficiencies / Reductions
- Route and Other Service Efficiencies
- Draw Down of Reserves
- Reduction of Discretionary Funding to Other Providers
- Service Reductions
- Fare Increases



# **ES- SAC Receipt Declines**

- SAC (Service Availability Charge) Funds Capital Projects
- Housing and Commercial Development Declines
- Reduction in Service Availability Charge Receipts
- Continued Decline = Insufficient 2010 Reserves
- Interventions Under Consideration:
  - Raising SAC Rates
  - Shift of Capital Funding from SAC to Current Users

# **Housing and Redevelopment Authority**

- \$4 Billion Available Nationally
- 75% Formula / 25% Competitive
- Energy Efficiency Projects and Critical Repairs
- Estimated Council Share of Formula: \$235,000



# **Brownfields Program**

- \$100 Million Available Nationally
- 100% Competitive
- Site Assessments and Clean-up
- Waiting on Additional Information
  - Implemented by U.S. EPA
  - Minnesota PCA & DEED

# **Opportunities for** Wastewater Funding



### **Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF)**

- \$4 B Available Nationally
- ♦ Clean Water SRF Funds for Minnesota → Minnesota Public Facilities Authority (PFA)
- \$73 M Expected for MN Clean Water Projects
- "Priority" to State wastewater project lists ready to proceed to construction within 12 months
  - 50% for grants, principle forgiveness, neg. interest loans
  - 20% for green infrastructure, efficiency and innovation projects
  - Preference to projects initiated within 120 days

### **Green Infrastructure...**

- EPA guidance not yet finalized
- EPA will require State to solicit projects
- Matching MCES projects to "Green" categories
  - Retrofit programs to keep wet weather out of sewer systems
  - Reuse projects that reduce energy consumption
  - Projects that demonstrate climate change improvement



# **PFA/Council Communications**

- 12/2/08: MCES sends 5 stimulus-ready projects to PFA
- 2/13/08: PFA distributes board packet
  - Excludes MCES from stimulus funds
  - Increases subsidized loan from \$50 M to \$80 M (\$3 M benefit)
- 2/19/09 PFA Board meeting:
  - Peter Bell and Bill Moore testified
  - Exclusion of MCES projects modified (but unclear)
    - MCES still limited to \$80 million loan (at 1.5% discount)
    - May include 5% grant
- 2/24/09: Letter to PFA renewing request and seeking clarification

# ERRP Transportation



### **ERRP Transportation Funds**

- Nationwide \$48 B for Transportation:
  - Highways & Bridges (3% Enhancements): \$27.5 B
  - Transit Specific: \$6.9 B
- Minnesota's Share:
  - Highways & Bridges: \$502 M
  - Transit Specific: \$94 M (Urban and Rural)
  - Nationwide Competitive Funds: ?



# **Metro Share - Highways and Bridges**

- 50% of \$502 M to Metro Area
- Metro Area Split
  - 70% to MnDOT: \$170 M
  - 30% to Council/TAB: \$75 M
- 50% of Enhancements to Metro Area
- Funds Can Be Used for Transit Projects



# **Transit Specific**

- Rural 5311 Funds: \$19 M
- Greater Minnesota Urban Transit Funds: \$6 M
- Metro Area Transit Funds:
  - Capital Assistance Formula Funds (5307): \$67 M
  - Fixed Guideway Infrastructure Funds (5309): \$2 M

# **Competitive Funds**

#### Surface Transportation Grants: \$1.5 B


- National or Regional Impact Required
- Funds Projects With Costs Between \$20 M and \$300 M
- Highway, Transit and Freight Projects Eligible

### High Speed Rail / Intercity Passenger Rail: \$8 B

- Competitive Funds for Fuel Efficient Transit Vehicles
  - Energy Efficiency Block Grants (EEBG) (\$400 M nationwide)
  - Alternative Buses and Trucks (\$300 M)
  - Diesel Emissions Reduction (\$300 M)



Metro Area – Decision Tree – Federal Transportation Funds



Any project in the Adopted TIP which will be funded with Economic Recovery Funding will need to be "Backfilled" with new projects

# **ERRP Funds Schedule**

- Initial MnDOT TIP Amendment: Full Council Today
- March Amendment for MnDOT Projects ~ \$100 M
- Later Amendments for Transit and Local Projects
- Obligation Requirements:
  - MnDOT Projects: 50% by 120 Days, 100% by 1 Year
  - Transit projects: 50% by 180 Days, 100% by 1 Year
  - MPO Projects: 100% by 1 Year
