Subject: 2009-2012 TIP Amendment to Allocate American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Funds, TAB Action 2009-19

#### **Proposed Action:**

That the Metropolitan Council concur with the Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) action to amend the 2009-2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include 22 MnDOT projects on metro area trunk highways that may be funded using American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds.

#### Summary of Committee Discussion / Questions:

Carl Ohrn, MTS Planning Analyst, presented this item; Kevin Roggenbuck, TAB Liaison, and John Chiglo, MnDOT, were also present to answer questions from committee members.

Committee discussed the motion and McFarlin requested information about the Greater Minnesota project schedules (letting dates) and why the rush for this TIP amendment to include smaller projects. Staff clarified that it is MnDOT's opinion that this is the prudent and proactive thing to do to in order to ensure that people are put to work as soon as possible in case the TH169/I-494 project is not a possible option. McFarlin has a concern that by approving this motion, a signal would be sent to the FHWA that we are willing to accept something other than the two big projects. Legal Counsel has stated that the motion cannot be divided. He, therefore, moved the motion below.

Leppik requested that the Council be provided with information on the TAB's approach to local match for projects.

Motion by McFarlin, seconded by Leppik to **move the action forward to the full Council** for action at the 4/08/09 Council meeting **with no recommendation from the Transportation Committee**, at which time representatives from MnDOT and FHWA give an update on the discussions and negotiations around the TH169/I-494 project.

### **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council concur with the Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) action to amend the 2009-2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include 22 MnDOT projects on metro area trunk highways that may be funded using American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds.

### Background

These projects totaling \$125.6 million, are the second set of projects in the Metro District that may be funded using ARRA funds. Most of these projects will be funded 100% with federal ARRA funds from the state's (MnDOT) allocation. The one exception is the TH 610 project which will use \$84 million from the MnDOT share of ARRA funds and \$2 million from the metro area local share of the ARRA funds.

One provision of the ARRA requires 50% of state funds to be obligated within 120 days. These projects will allow MnDOT to meet this requirement. This amendment will allow MnDOT to keep these projects moving toward potential April and May letting dates. However, MnDOT will not move forward with these projects (with the exception of the TH 610 project) if there is a decision made at the April 15, 2009 TAB meeting to fund the 169/I494 interchange rather than the smaller projects in this TIP amendment. This action also positions Minnesota well to compete for funds redistributed from other states' ARRA funds, should they become available. The projects are consistent with the guiding principles developed by both MnDOT and the Transportation Advisory Board and are consistent with the Metropolitan Council 2030 Transportation Policy Plan.

### Rationale

These projects can be ready to have contracts let quickly to meet the 120-day obligation deadline for 50% of state ARRA funds.

### Funding

The \$125.6 million of ARRA funds includes \$123.8 M of MnDOT ARRA funds and \$2.0 million of TAB/Council regional ARRA funds for TH 610.

### **Known Support / Opposition**

The TAB passed the amendment unanimously even though there was significant discussion.

**SUBJECT**: 2009-2012 TIP Amendment to include MN/DOT projects to be funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Program.

**MOTION:** The Transportation Advisory Board amended the 2009-2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include projects identified in the MN/DOT TIP Amendment letter to be funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Program.

**BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE OF ACTION**: These projects totaling \$125.6 million, identified in the attached TIP Amendment request, are the second set of projects in the Metro District to be funded through the ARRA. Most of these projects will be funded 100% with federal ARRA funds from the state's (MN/DOT) allocation. One provision of the ARRA requires 50% of state funds be authorized within 120 days. The projects in the attached list meet the requirements of the ARRA and advance projects to meet these deadlines. It also positions Minnesota well for redistributed funds, should they become available. The projects are also consistent with the guiding principles developed by both MN/DOT and the Transportation Advisory Board and are consistent with the Metropolitan Council Transportation Policy Plan.

MN/DOT will pursue approval of these projects into the State TIP from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). After receiving approval from the FHWA, MN/DOT can quickly get these projects out for bids and obligate the Recovery funds. MN/DOT will pursue a spring contract letting for the TH 610 project; however, all the remaining projects on this list will not proceed to letting using the Recovery funds if the I-494/TH169 interchange is included in the ARRA project list. MN/DOT will submit an Interchange Access Request to the FHWA requesting approval of the reduced scope design. The FHWA response is expected by April 15.

Please amend the 2009 – 2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include these projects in 2009. The projects are being submitted with the following information:

#### **PROJECT IDENTIFICATION:**

#### **PROJECT BACKGROUND:**

- 1. Briefly describe why amendment is needed (e.g., project in previous STIP but not completed; illustrative project and funds now available; discretionary funds received; inadvertently not included in STIP).
  - President Obama signed the \$787 billion American Recovery and Reinvestment Act into law on Tuesday, February 17, 2009. This bill included increased funding for infrastructure across the country. Minnesota is expected to receive approximately \$500 million. One provision of the bill requires 50% of the funds to states be authorized within 120 days.

> The projects in the attached list meet the requirements of this Economic Recovery Program and advance projects to meet these deadlines. It also positions the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area well for redistributed funds, should they become available. The projects are also consistent with the guiding principles as developed by both MnDOT and the Metropolitan Council. Criteria used to develop the list included:

- Job Creation should be the overriding objective for project selection
- Project "readiness" for authorization or contract letting as well as project deliverability should be given priority
- Consistency with performance based plans; projects of value to region or state.
- Projects already in the out years of the STIP/TIP where project development is complete or near completion should be considered for advancement
- Project timing should be considered so as to spread the demand for labor, equipment, and capital resources over the entire eligibility period and ultimately keep material and labor costs in check.
- Work type balance

According to rates from the U.S. DOT, the projects in this amendment are expected to create approximately 3393 jobs (27 jobs per million construction dollars).

2. How is Fiscal Constraint Maintained as required by 23 CFR 450.216?

• These projects will be funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. Based on the our current understanding of the funding contained within the bill, , Mn/DOT will receive approximately \$502 million. The total amount assumed for the Twin Cities Metro Area is approximately \$250 million. The breakdown of funds is shown below:

• The projects in this amendment equal \$125.65 million (Formal Amendment total = \$109.5 million; Administrative Modifications = \$16.2 million).
