Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to award and execute a construction contract for Interceptor Trenchless Rehabilitation - Phase 2, MSB-7111 1 and 2, and 1-GV-460, MCES Project Number 806920, Contract No. 09P050, with Lametti & Sons as the responsive, responsible low bidder at \$2,997,576.

Background

This contract is the second of three phases for the Interceptor Trenchless Rehabilitation Project. Each phase will be bid under a separate contract. Phase 2 includes rehabilitation of approximately 3,050 feet of 54-inch diameter, 1,835 feet of 48-inch diameter and 175 feet of 36-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipe for interceptor MSB-7111 in South St. Paul and approximately 3,700 feet of 36-inch diameter for interceptor 1-GV-460 in Golden Valley. The rehabilitation is necessary to remedy corrosion damage, prevent root intrusion, and eliminate infiltration. Cured-in-Place Pipe (CIPP) is the proposed method of rehabilitation.

A formal Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised and five bids were received on September 1, 2009, ranging from \$2,943,999.70 to \$3,390,794. The lowest bid included conditions and limitations contrary to the bid instructions and was rejected as being non-responsive. Lametti & Sons, Inc. was the second lowest bidder and was found to be responsive and responsible. Their bid in the amount of \$2,997,576 was approximately 33% below the engineer's estimate of \$4,471,658.

Rationale

Construction contracts exceeding \$1,000,000 require Metropolitan Council authorization.

Funding

Funding for this project is provided in the 2009 Capital Budget, Project Number 806920.
