To issue a Notice-To-Proceed (NTP) to AECOM USA, Inc. in an amount not-to-exceed \$7.0 million to continue advancing Preliminary Engineering. The total contract spending authority with this NTP shall not exceed \$65.2 million.

Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator:

To negotiate and execute an amendment to the professional services contract with AECOM USA, Inc. to increase the contract spending authority to an amount not-to-exceed \$65.2 million to continue the advancement of Preliminary Engineering and

To issue a Notice-To-Proceed (NTP) to AECOM USA, Inc. in an amount not-to-exceed \$7.0 million to continue advancing Preliminary Engineering. The total contract spending authority with this NTP shall not exceed \$65.2 million.

Background

- On June 13, 2007, the Council authorized the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute a professional services contract with DMJM Harris (AECOM USA) for Engineering Services for the Central Corridor Light Rail Transit (CCLRT) project in an amount not to exceed \$91 million and to issue an NTP for Preliminary Engineering and advancing Preliminary Engineering activities.
- On November 18, 2009, the Council authorized the Regional Administrator to increase the authorized contract spending authority by \$5.9 million and to issue an NTP in an amount not-to-exceed \$58.2 million to continue to advance Preliminary Engineering.

The contract includes provisions to issue separate NTPs for Preliminary Engineering and Advancing Preliminary Engineering, Final Design, and Design Support during Construction. The Council has the right to terminate the contract at any time, should that be necessary.

Rationale

The CCLRT project schedule called for FTA approval to enter Final Design on November 23. FTA has advised that approval to enter Final Design is contingent upon completion of an Environmental Assessment for the Infill Stations, which is currently scheduled to be completed by late February 2010.

Council approval to issue an NTP to continue advancing Preliminary Engineering in 2010 will allow the consultant to continue with the design effort in preparation to enter into Final Design. If FTA approval to enter Final Design is not granted by February 2010, additional contract authority to continue advancing Preliminary Engineering will be required.

Funding

Funding for advancing Preliminary Engineering is available from the 2008 and 2009 State of Minnesota general obligation bonds, 2009 Counties Transit Improvement Board (CTIB) Grant Agreement, and the Cooperative Funding Agreement with the Ramsey and Hennepin County Regional Rail Authorities.

Known Support/Opposition

Council funding partners, Ramsey County Regional Rail Authority, Hennepin County Regional Rail Authority, and the Counties Transit Improvement Board have committed funds for design and engineering activities.
