### **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute a cooperative agreement with Dakota County for inclusion of 3-LV-610 interceptor improvements in the Cedar Avenue BRT Improvements Project.

### Background

Dakota County is constructing Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) facilities within the Cedar Avenue right-of-way and the proposed BRT lane will overlie interceptor 3-LV-610. Recent inspection of the interceptor facilities revealed hydrogen sulfide corrosion of approximately 3,300 feet of 24-inch reinforced concrete pipe and associated maintenance structures within the road right-of-way. Implementation of interceptor improvements concurrent with the BRT project will minimize traffic disruption and public nuisance associated with construction in a heavily traveled roadway.

# Rationale

Agreements with outside agencies require Council authorization.

#### Funding

Estimated project cost is \$1,500,000. Construction funding has been included in the 2010 Capital Budget for Project 906903.

# **Known Support / Opposition**

No known opposition. Dakota County has agreed to the incorporation of the interceptor work into the BRT project.
