PROJECT BACKGROUND:

1. Briefly describe why amendment is needed (e.g., project in previous STIP but not completed; illustrative project and funds now available; discretionary funds received; inadvertently not included in STIP).

In August 2007, the Twin Cities was one of five regions selected nationally for an Urban Partnership Agreement (UPA) award. Since that time several projects have been implemented utilizing most of the funds except for a small portion of the \$16.4M of Transportation, Community and system Preservation Program (TCSP) funds.

In order to utilize the remaining funds, a work plan was submitted to Washington D.C. FHWA and approved in December 2009. The project will build the required noisewalls on the west side of I-35W in advance of expanding the MnPASS system 2 miles further south in Burnsville by 2012. This work is being separated out from the lane extension work to meet the Federal request to encumber TCSP funds by September 20, 2010. The east side noise walls will be constructed during the lane expansion work.
