Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to execute a grant with Minnesota Valley Transit Authority (MVTA) for up to \$832,266 for the purchase of two (2) forty foot replacement buses.

Background

The vehicles purchased under this agreement will replace existing buses that either meet or exceed their useful life as established by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA).

Rationale

This grant allows MVTA to procure two replacement buses using regional transit capital funds distributed by the Metropolitan Council.

Funding

The funding for this grant is for an amount not to exceed \$832,266 in regional transit capital bonds that are included in the 2010 Authorized Capital Program. The actual grant amount will be based on a regionally determined base price for this vehicle type plus five percent as designated in the recently adopted regional policies and procedures.
