Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorizes its Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute MCES Contract No. 10P224A with Brown and Caldwell in the amount of \$1,000,000 for full service interceptor architectural/engineering services.

Background

MCES utilizes professional architectural/engineering services on its capital improvement projects during the planning, design, and construction phases in several areas of expertise including civil, structural, architectural, electrical, mechanical, and process engineering. This business item recommends contract award to Brown and Caldwell to provide these services for work on MCES capital projects. A Request for Proposals was issued, and twelve proposals were received. The evaluation committee recommends awarding a three-year contract to Brown and Caldwell.

The firm has a local office and can provide all required services locally. The firm has proposed a highly skilled team to deliver the proposed services. This contract is a cost reimbursement type of contract and utilizes project specific work task orders to authorize work.

Rationale

Professional services contracts with an amount exceeding \$250,000 require Metropolitan Council approval.
