BACKGROUND A ND PURPOSE OF ACTION: After the successful implementation of the north-south spine of Marquette and 2nd Avenues in Downtown Minneapolis using Urban Partnership Agreement funding, Metro Transit conducted a study to implement similar improvements on an east-west spine. 7th Street and 8th Street were selected as the location of this east-west spine. Metro Transit will apply for \$2,560,000 in Section 5307 funding administered by the Federal Transit Administration to help complete this project. Access to these funds requires that they be identified in the STIP with a local funding match of 20%, which Metro Transit is providing (\$640,000). Metro Transit is taking advantage of the opportunity to complete this project in conjunction with a City of Minneapolis project to resurface 7th and 8th Street with federal funds available from the 35W Bridge Collapse. The transit upgrades that are part of this TIP amendment do not include this Minneapolis component of the project. This project includes new bus shelters, real time information signs, and curb extensions to improve conditions for transit passengers, pedestrians and local retailers.

Although it is not noted in the TIP amendment letter, the requested amendment is consistent with the Metropolitan Council Transportation Policy Plan adopted on November 10, 2010.

PROJECT BACKGROUND:

1. Briefly describe why amendment is needed (e.g., project in previous STIP but not included; illustrative project and funds now available; discretionary funds received; inadvertently not included in STIP)

In 2009, the Met Council and the City of Minneapolis (City) implemented transit improvements along the north-south spine of Marquette and Second Avenues as identified in the "Access Minneapolis" transportation plan and administered through the Urban Partnership Agreement. These upgrades have been successful in improving transit capacity, reliability and speed. Related enhancements will likewise improve service along an "east-west spine" in downtown Minneapolis. A study conducted in 2010 identified 7th and 8th streets south as the best option for an east-west transit spine and this project now seeks to implement these transit improvements. The transit upgrades that are planned include new bus shelters, real time information signs, and curb extensions to improve conditions for transit passengers, pedestrians and local retailers.

For project efficiency and economics, the transit improvements sought, by adding this project to the TIP, will be completed in conjunction with a city project to resurface 7th and 8th Streets during the summer of 2011. Funding has already been awarded for the city resurfacing project and the resurfacing is a separate project that is not part of this TIP amendment. This TIP amendment only seeks funding for the transit-related improvements to 7th and 8th streets south.

The total East-West Transit Spine project is estimated at \$3.2 million. This funding will consist of Federal Transit Administration (FTA) 5307 funds (\$2,560,000) and Regional Transit Capital funds (\$640,000). The project was identified in Met Council's 2010-2016 Capital Improvement Plan. FTA 5307 funds are "formula funds" allotted on an annual basis as determined by demographic and transit statistics. Access to FTA 5307 funds requires that a project be identified in the STIP and a local funding match of 20%. A TIP and subsequent STIP amendment are sought to enable Metro Transit to apply for these funds. Availability of Federal funds is anticipated during the second quarter, 2011.
