Background

Minnesota is forecasted to receive an estimated extra \$95 million of additional federal funds in FFY 2011 because a new federal transportation act has not been passed. Of that \$95 million, MnDOT Metro District will receive \$38.5 million with \$12 million going to the locals. The TAB elected to distribute the available formula funds for the seven counties using the 2010 State Aid allocation. Each county has selected projects that can

be delivered in FFY 2011 that have no right-of-way impacts or require environmental review. The selected projects are primarily preservation and pedestrian system retrofits.

Rationale

In order to spend federal transportation funds, the projects must be in the current TIP.

Funding

The federal funds are new to the region and the local match is provided by the counties.
