Call to Order and Approval of Agenda

Committee Consent List

2011-199 - Amendment to 2011 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

It was moved by Cunningham and seconded by Elkins,

"That the Metropolitan Council amend the 2011 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) to identify specific additional projects."

Motion carried.

<u>2011-209 - Park Acquisition Opportunity Grant for 1.4 acre parcel easement in Lebanon Hills Regional Park, Dakota County</u>

It was moved by Cunningham and seconded by Elkins,

"That the Metropolitan Council authorize a grant of \$17,700 from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund Acquisition Account in the Park Acquisition Opportunity Fund to Dakota County to partially finance the acquisition of a permanent easement on the 1.4 acre (Doebber) parcel as depicted in Figure 1 for Lebanon Hills Regional Park. The grant should be financed with:

\$10,620 from the 2009 Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund appropriation \$7,080 from Metropolitan Council bonds"

Motion carried.

2011-203 - Authorization to Award and Execute Construction Contract 10P257A for the MWWTP Double Barrel Interceptor, Flood Wall and Miscellaneous Improvements, MCES Project Numbers 805960, 805964, and 805993

It was moved by Cunningham and seconded by Elkins,

"That the Metropolitan Council authorize its Regional Administrator to award and execute a contract for construction of the MWWTP double barrel interceptor, flood wall and miscellaneous improvements, MCES Project Numbers 805960, 805964, and 805993, Contract No. 10P257A, with PCi Roads for its low bid of \$4,738,547."

Report of the Transportation Committee

2011-200 - Authorization to Execute Contract No. 11P002A, Diesel Fuel Supply REBID

It was moved by Elkins and seconded by Munt,

"That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to execute contract No. 11P002A with Hartland Fuel Products, LLC for the supply of diesel fuel to the Metropolitan Council/Metro Transit for a two-year period with options to extend for years three and four. The contract will be in an amount not to exceed \$124,000,000."

<u>2011-214 - Defer Regional Transit Capital Local Match Commitment to Potential CMAQ Projects</u>

It was moved by Elkins and seconded by Schreiber,

"That the Metropolitan Council not commit to providing regional transit capital (RTC) bonds as local match for Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) projects in advance of submittal to the 2011 Regional Solicitation process for funding in 2015 and 2016."

"That the Metropolitan Council adopt the Advisory Comments and Review Record and take the following actions:

Recommendations of the Community Development Committee:

- 1. Authorize the City of Brooklyn Park to put its 2030 Comprehensive Plan Update into effect.
- 2. Adopt the revised forecasts for population, households, and employment for the City, as detailed in Tables 1 and 2 of the attached Review Record.
- **3.** Revise the planning area designation of the City from Developing to Developed in the 2030 Regional Development Framework.
- 4. Advise the City to
 - a. participate in Council activities to monitor redevelopment in Developed Communities, and
 - b. implement advisory comments in the Review Record for Transportation and Subsurface Sewage Treatment Systems.
