#### **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute a Subordinate Funding Agreement (SFA) #01.2 in an amount not to exceed \$481,000 under the existing Master Funding Agreement to reimburse the City of St. Paul for construction inspection related services in 2012 for the Central Corridor LRT Project.

## Background

On September 9, 2009, the Council authorized the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute a Master Funding Agreement with the City of St. Paul for construction of the Central Corridor Light Rail Transit (CCLRT) Project. The Master Funding Agreement established the contractual framework between the Metropolitan Council and the City of St. Paul. SFA's provide the mechanism to transfer funds between the Metropolitan Council and the City of St. Paul.

The Metropolitan Council will reimburse the City of St. Paul for up to \$481,000 for construction inspection related services performed by City of St. Paul staff. This work includes traffic signal and street lighting inspection, signal timing modifications, and sewer and street construction inspection in coordination with the CCLRT Construction work.

# Rationale

The Metropolitan Council and the City of St. Paul will continue to work cooperatively during construction of the CCLRT Project to ensure traffic signals, sewer and street construction, and street lighting are installed and are functioning properly.

SFAs exceeding \$250,000 require Metropolitan Council authorization.

## Funding

Funding is available from the CCLRT Project Contingency Budget.

## Known Support / Opposition

The City of St. Paul supports this subordinate funding agreement. No known opposition.
