Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council concur with the Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) action to amend the 2012-2015 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include SP#s: 13-00001, 27-00306, 27-00307, 62-00206, 62-00207: rail crossing safety projects to replace antiquated equipment.

Background

This amendment is needed to add five rail crossing safety projects (four of which are in the Metropolitan Council jurisdiction, one is in Chisago County) to the 2012-2015 TIP. MnDOT currently has a set-aside of federal rail safety funds (RRS) in the 2012-2015 STIP for rail crossing safety projects administered by MnDOT's Office of Freight and Commercial Vehicles. This amendment adds a portion of the funding from this set-aside to these rail crossing safety projects to replace antiquated safety equipment.

Rationale

The Transportation Advisory Board approves formal amendments to the Transportation Improvement Program. The Metropolitan Council concurs with the action of the TAB. These projects are exempt from air quality conformity analysis. They do not affect fiscal constraint as they use funds from an existing set-aside in the TIP.

Funding

These projects use State Rail Bond funds and a funding set-aside in the current TIP SP#880C-RAIL-12 (Seq. #2182) for rail grade crossing projects.

Known Support / Opposition

No known opposition. MnDOT supports this amendment.

BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE OF ACTION: MnDOT has a set-aside in the 2012-2015 TIP for rail crossings projects that are determined by MnDOT's Office of Freight and Commercial Vehicles. MnDOT would like to add \$5,000 from this set-aside to each of these five projects to replace antiquated equipment. Additional background material is attached.

RELATIONSHIP TO REGIONAL POLICY: Federal law requires that all transportation projects that will be partially funded with federal funds must be in an approved Transportation Improvement Program and meet the following four tests: fiscal constraint; consistency with the adopted regional transportation plan; air quality conformity and opportunity for public input. It is the TAB's responsibility to adopt and amend the TIP according to these four requirements.

PROJECT BACKGROUND:

1. Briefly describe why amendment is needed (e.g. project in previous TIP but not completed; illustrative project and funds now available; discretionary funds received; inadvertently not included in TIP).

Project 880C-RAIL-12 is in SFY 2012 of the 2012-15 STIP with a total of \$88,900 including \$80,000 in federal funds and \$8,900 in other funds. This is a funding set aside for rail grade crossing projects for SFY 2012. The MnDOT Office of Freight & Commercial Vehicle Operation (OFCVO) has decided to use the funds in this set aside to replace antiquated equipment at various railroad crossings statewide. This formal STIP amendment is being done to identify five (5) of the projects that OFCVO has selected.

* SP 880C-RAIL-12 (Seq. # 2182) is in SFY 2012 of the STIP with a total of \$88,900 including \$80,000 in federal funds and \$8,900 in other funds. This is a funding set aside for rail grade crossing projects for SFY 2012. The new rail projects being added with this formal amendment will use a total of \$25,000 of these federal funds (see page 5 for funding breakdowns). The federal funds being used will be matched with state rail bonds. \$40,000 in federal funds has already been identified by other projects statewide, the remaining \$23, 900 in federal funds will be used to fund other rail projects yet to be identified for SFY 2012. Available federal funds from a funding set aside and state rail bonds will be used to fully fund these new rail projects, therefore fiscal constraint is maintained.

CONSISTENCY WITH MPO LONG RANGE PLAN:

This amendment is consistent with the Metropolitan Council Transportation Policy Plan, adopted on January 14, 2009, with FHWA/FTA conformity determination established on September 16, 2009. The amendment is also consistent with the 2030 Policy Plan update adopted by the Metropolitan Council on November 10, 2010 with FHWA/FTA conformity determination established on February 23, 2011.
