Call to Order and Approval of Agenda

2012-161 Authorization to Enter into a Labor Agreement with the International Union of Painters and Allied Trades, Local No. 61, AFL-CIO

"That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to enter into a collective bargaining agreement with the International Union of Painters and Allied Trades, Local No. 61, for the period of May 1, 2012 – April 30, 2015."

2012-162 Park Acquisition Opportunity Fund Grant Request for Rush Creek Regional Trail, Three Rivers Park District

"That the Metropolitan Council authorize a grant of up to \$255,750 from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund Acquisition Account in the Park Acquisition Opportunity Fund to Three Rivers Park District to finance 75% of the acquisition costs to acquire 5.87 acres from the City of Brooklyn Park as depicted in Figure 1 for Rush Creek Regional Trail. The grant should be financed with:

\$153,450 from the 2009 Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund appropriation \$102,300 from Metropolitan Council bonds."

2012-163 Park Acquisition Opportunity Fund Grant Request for Baker Park Reserve, Three Rivers Park District

Report of the Transportation Committee

2012-165 Central Corridor Light Rail Transit (Green Line): 50% Constructed Contingency Commitment

It was moved by Elkins, seconded by Munt

"That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to:

- Authorize the use of \$7.5 million in Central Corridor Light Rail Transit (CCLRT) (Green Line) project contingency funds at the 50% constructed milestone towards the Minneapolis Interchange Project (\$4 million), the St. Paul Union Depot Project (\$3 million) and the relocation of traction power substation #12 from the Central Station block in downtown St. Paul (\$500,000), subject to FTA concurrence;
- Negotiate and execute a subordinate funding agreement with the Hennepin County Regional Railroad Authority for the allocation of CCLRT (Green Line) contingency funds to the Minneapolis Interchange Project;
- Negotiate and execute a subordinate funding agreement with the Ramsey County Regional Railroad Authority for the allocation of CCLRT (Green Line) contingency funds to the St. Paul Union Depot Project."

Motion carried.

2012-177 The Interchange—Authorization to Negotiate and Execute Two Grant Agreements and One Master Cooperation and Funding Agreement

"That the Metropolitan Council (Council) authorizes the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute the following agreements for the development of The Interchange project:

- Grant Agreement for TIGER III (Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery) grant with the US Department of Transportation (USDOT), the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and Hennepin County Regional Rail Authority (HCRRA); and a Subrecipient Grant Agreement (SGA) with HCRRA for transfer of TIGER III funds
- Grant agreement for 2011 and 2012 State GO Bonds with HCRRA
- Master Cooperation and Funding Agreement with HCRRA for transfer of Council funds; and subordinate funding agreements to identify funding sources and track project costs."

Reports

Chair:

We have delayed moving forward with a contract with URS because we learned that we were going to receive a report about the Sabo bridge. We have now received an executive summary of that report, but not the full report. We are going to ask our staff to do the same due diligence work that we have done prior to receiving this report, creating an addendum to the work that has already been done.

Met with Councilmember Samuels to discuss the Bottineau Corridor and the alignments for that corridor.

Met with Commissioner Peter McLaughlin.

Met with Congresswoman Betty McCollum.

Participated in a meeting with the Governor and the Governor's staff about setting minority workforce goals for the State of Minnesota and the region. Wanda Kirkpatrick also participated in this meeting.

Participated in a CTIB meeting.

Had a tour of the SWLRT Corridor, which was very interesting.

Attended a Governor's Cabinet meeting at the end of May which included a post-session wrap-up.

Attended the Transportation Finance Advisory Committee meeting. TFAC will be focusing on the metropolitan region and transportation planning, and how transportation policy and finance work come together.

Participated in the Center for Transportation Studies Executive Committee meeting. Addressed the Mid-Continent Regional Science Association at the Science Museum. They are a group of scientists from academic institutions and practitioners who focus on research around regions and regional issues. CM Commers was also in attendance.

Council Members

Elkins—Attended a MnDOT Corridor Investment Management Strategy meeting in Edina. It was a good outreach effort and there were four meetings held around the region.

Participated in the official grand opening of Richfield City Hall. Participated in the MN Transportation Alliances Fly-In to Washington, D.C. and had opportunities to meet with several members of the legislative staffs of our congressional delegation, as well as policy makers at the US Dept. of Transportation.

Commers—Represented the Council at an opening last week for the farmers' market lofts project in St. Paul, for which the Council has been funding partner. All 56 units were leased by the time the project opened. Participated in a transportation workshop with the St. Paul City Council which relied on the regional projections that the Council prepared.

Munt—Has been getting an earful from Hopkins residents who are concerned about the relocation of a sewage lift station to park land nestled in a residential area. The way Environmental Services handled a public meeting on the topic was very impressive. Brimeyer—The City of Golden Valley has been looking at the Bottineau transit way study and they have a lot of questions. Met with the Mayor and Council members a few times. They have a lot of concerns and will be taking it up at their next Council meeting. Cunningham—Participated in the Bottineau PAC meeting where a vote was taken for the potential Bottineau LRT. Golden Valley is one of the city's along the route that has not signed on. The Minneapolis Park Board is also concerned about environmental impacts along the line. Had the opportunity to present ideas and concepts at the Fair Housing Equity dialogue at the Wilder Foundation, which was also attended by CM Wulff and CM Smith. A number of advocacy organizations talked about our requirement under the sustainable communities grant to develop and implement an analysis of impediments to fair housing.

Regional Administrator—No report.

General Counsel—No report.
