#### Report of the Environment Committee

#### 2012-219 Adoption of MCES 2013 Wastewater Rates and Charges

It was moved by Rummel, seconded by Wulff

"That the Metropolitan Council adopts the following wastewater rates and charges to be effective January 1, 2013:

- Metropolitan Wastewater Charge (total of Municipal wastewater charges) of \$178,824,000,
- Sewer Availability Charge (SAC): \$2,435 per Residence or Residential Equivalent Capacity,
- Temporary Capacity Charge: \$1.22 per thousand gallons,
- Industrial Strength Charge: \$.172 per excess pound of TSS (total suspended solids),
- Industrial Strength Charge: \$.086 per excess pound of COD (chemical oxygen demand),
- Standard Load Charge: \$53.20 per thousand gallons,
- Holding Tank Load Charge: \$8.81 per thousand gallons,
- Portable Toilet Waste Load Charge: \$67.79 per thousand gallons,
- Collar County Load Charge: \$68.20 per thousand gallons,
- Strength component of Industrial Load Charge \$.3510 per excess pound of TSS,
- Strength component of Industrial Load Charge \$.1755 per excess pound of COD,
- Out-of-Region Load Charge Component for hauled waste: \$15.00 per thousand gallons, and
- Industrial Permit Fees as shown on Attachment A
- I/I Surcharge Exceedance Rate: \$398,000 per million gallons/day (rate of measured flow)

### 2012-216 Cubic Transportation Systems—Fare Collections Procurements

It was moved by Elkins, seconded by Munt

"That the Metropolitan Council award and execute a sole source contract with Cubic Transportation Systems (Cubic) for production and delivery of 68 ticket vending machines, 114 smart card validators, 50 handheld smart card readers, coin hoppers and spare parts at a total cost not to exceed \$9,429,332."

# 2012-218 147<sup>th</sup> Street Station Phase 2 Joint Powers Agreement with DCRRA and City of Apple Valley

It was moved by Elkins, seconded by Wulff

"That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) with the Dakota County Regional Railroad Authority (DCRRA) and the City of Apple Valley to provide the City with the option to fund the METRO Red Line 147<sup>th</sup> Street Station Phase 2 so that it is constructed concurrent with Phase 1."

#### Motion carried.

#### 2012-236 Tokens: Temporary Fare Change Clarification

It was moved by Elkins, seconded by Rummel

"That the Metropolitan Council approve a Temporary Fare Change for Tokens where a single token will be valid for both local peak and off-peak and express fares for up to a value of \$2.25 with the token sales price set at \$1.75, effective for the period of August 1, 2012 to April 30, 2013."

### Special Counsel Report: Southwest LRT Engineering Services Consultant Contract Procurement

In light of the cable failure on the Sabo bridge, the Council engaged outside counsel (special counsel) to examine responsibility issues. Special counsel prepared a due diligence report. Based on that report, staff were prepared to move forward with a recommendation on this procurement, but they did so without the benefit of the Sabo bridge investigation report. The special counsel gave a report regarding the findings of the Sabo bridge investigation.

### 2012-234 Southwest Light Rail Transit (Green Line Extension): Engineering Services Consultant Contract Procurement

It was moved by Elkins, seconded by Munt

"That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to:

Cancel the procurement for Contract 11P173 for an Engineering Services Consultant for Southwest Light Rail Transit (SWLRT);

Develop and issue new Requests for Proposals for Engineering Services Consultant(s) for developing and engineering documents to 30% completion of project engineering; Develop and issue a new Request for Proposal for an independent engineering peer review consultant tasked with review of contract deliverables generated by the Engineering Services Consultant(s)."

Bob Green of Alliant Engineering, Vince Montgomery of TKDA, Tom Bader of URS, David Knaeble of PPA, James Garrett of 4RM+ULA, Glenn Schreiner of Parsons Brinckerhoff, and Sirish Samba of MRFA spoke in favor of awarding the contract to URS.

Motion carried.
