That the Metropolitan Council amend the 2012 Unified Capital Program as indicated and in accordance with attached business item and table.

Summary of Committee Discussion / Questions:

Transportation Committee – September 10, 2012. Staff presented the business item and answered Committee-members questions. The business item included two proposed amendments:

\$1,496,149 in new authority for project 35834-Metro Mobility ACL/MDC/IVR \$2,200,000 in new authority for the 147th Street Station (Phase II) on Cedar Avenue BRT

The authorization for the 147th Street Station project was contingent on the City of Apple Valley approving implementation of Phase II of the project. The motion passed unanimously.

At its September 11, 2012 meeting, the City of Apple Valley did not approve implementation of Phase II of the 147th Street Station project.

Management Committee – September 12, 2012: Staff presented the business item without the \$2,200,000 authorization for Phase II of the 147th Street Station project and answered Committeemembers questions. The motion passed unanimously.

Background

This proposed amendment programs federal and regional funding to capital projects for Metropolitan Transportation Services in the Transportation Division.

Metropolitan Transportation Services

Reducing Funding Commitments: The proposed amendment reduces federal funding by \$1,003,851 for project 35774 – Regional AVL and reallocates the funding to the project listed below.

Increasing Funding Commitments: The proposed amendment increases funding and spending authority by a total of \$2,500,000 on project 35834 – Metro Mobility ACL/MDC/IVR. All the projects are in the adopted capital improvement program. Funding for these projects includes \$1,003,851 in federal funding reallocated from the project above and \$1,496,149 in regional funding.

Net Change in Authorization: \$1,496,149

Net Change to Current Year Budget: Based on the timing of projected expenditures for the proposed amendments, the 2012 Capital Budget is proposed to increase by \$ 1,496,149.

Rationale

This proposed amendment programs regional funds and increases multi-year spending authority. These capital projects will allow the Council to carry out its long-term capital improvement program for transit.

Fiscal Impact

The proposed amendment regional bonding for Metropolitan Transportation Services projects by \$1,496,149. There is available, un-programmed regional bonding authority provided by the Legislature to accommodate the additional bonding for Metro Transit.

The regional funding included in this proposed amendment was reflected in the adopted 2012-2017 Capital Improvement Program and related fiscal analysis.

Background

This proposed amendment authorizes new federal, local and regional funding for new projects as detailed in **ATTACHMENT 1**.

Metropolitan Transportation Services

Closing Projects: None

Reducing Funding Commitments:

Regional AVL- Project #35774

This amendment authorizes a reduction of \$1,003,851 in Section 5307 federal formula funding to MTS's regional fixed route AVL project. These funds will be reprogrammed into the region's new dial-a-ride AVL project. This project is identified in the CIP.

Increasing Authorized Funding / Authorize New Funding:

Metro Mobility – AVL/MDC/IVR - Project #35834

This amendment authorizes an additional \$1,003,851 in Section 5307 federal formula funding and \$1,496,149 in RTC funds to implement a regional dial-a-ride AVL system.

This project will benefit both the Transit Link and Metro Mobility programs. This project is identified in the CIP.

Change to Current Year Expenditures

Based on projected expenditures for the proposed amendments, the 2012 Capital Budget is proposed to be increased by \$1,496,149 for Metropolitan Transportation Services.

Rationale

This amendment is required to adjust federal and authorize new regional funding for existing projects within the Transportation Division's Authorized Capital Program. These activities will allow the Council to carry out its long-term capital improvement program for transit.

Fiscal Impact

This amendment provides \$1,496,149 in RTC funds to the Authorized Capital Program for transit projects.
