## 2006-27 Ratification of Declaration of Emergency to Repair Primary Digester at the Empire Wastewater Treatment Plant

It was moved by Wolter, seconded by Susag that the Metropolitan Council ratify the attached *Justification for and Declaration of Emergency* for repairing the primary digester at the Empire Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Motion carried. Placed on Council Consent Agenda.

819 Polymers to the Metro Wastewater Treatment Plant at a unit price of \$0,109 & \$1,05 per pound respectively.

## 2006-32 Authorization to Negotiate and Execute Contract for Professional Geotechnical and **Testing Services with American Engineering Testing**

Motion carried. Placed on Council Consent Agenda.

## 2006-34 Authorization to Negotiate and Execute Contract for Professional Geotechnical and **Testing Services with STS Consultants**

It was moved by Smith, seconded by Susag that the Metropolitan Council authorize its Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute a contract for professional geotechnical and testing services with Braun Intertec in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.

Motion carried. Placed on Council Consent Agenda.

### 2006-35 Authorization for a Joint Use Agreement with the City of Minneapolis at the Portland and Washington Regulator Site

It was moved by Wittsack, seconded by Susag that the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator negotiate and enter into a joint use agreement with the City of Minneapolis for access at the Portland & Washington Regulator site.

Motion carried. Placed on Council Consent Agenda.

#### 2006-36 Authorization to Negotiate and Execute Intergovernmental Agreement with City of Carver for Construction of Chaska West Interceptor - Phase II, MCES Project 803800

It was moved by Smith, seconded by Scherer that the Metropolitan Council authorize its Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute an intergovernmental agreement with the City of Carver for construction of Chaska West Interceptor - Phase II, MCES Project No. 803800. Motion carried.

### 2006-37 Authorization to Negotiate and Execute a Construction Cooperation Agreement with the University of Minnesota for the Oak Street Sewer Replacement

It was moved by Susag, seconded by Smith that the Metropolitan Council authorize staff to negotiate an Intergovernmental Agreement with the University of Minnesota and the City of Minneapolis to include construction of elements of the Oak Street sewer between 4<sup>th</sup> Street and Washington Avenue into the University Gopher Stadium project.

Motion carried. (As an employee of the University of Minnesota, Wolter recused himself from voting.)

## 2006-38 Authorization to Negotiate and Execute a Construction Cooperation Agreement with Hennepin County for Interceptor 1-MN-320 Improvements

It was moved by Wittsack, seconded by Susag that the Metropolitan Council authorize staff to negotiate an Intergovernmental Agreements with Hennepin County and Northstar Commuter Rail for the inclusion of interceptor improvements in the construction contracts for the Twins Ball Park and the rail facilities.

Motion carried. Placed on Council Consent Agenda.

## Inflow/Infiltration (I/I) Surcharge Update

Kyle Colvin, Assistant Manager-Engineering Planning, reported that out of the 105 communities that are part of the MDS, 45 were identified as surcharge communities. All 45 communities have committed to expend monies to abate I/I in 2007, and all but three have submitted a specific work plan to reduce or eliminate the 2007 I/I surcharge. In addition to continuing its regional system rehabilitation program, MCES will continue t to provide technical assistance, work with communities to evaluate eligible cost credits and submit work plans, and will enter into joint studies/projects with communities that contain regional interceptors within their corporate boundaries. Colvin gave a summary of ES activities as they relate to I/I programs and projects.
