2007-155 Authorization to Acquire Easements and to File Condemnation Petition – South Saint Paul Forcemain Improvements – MCES project 802710, Resolution No. 2007-12

It was moved by Susag, seconded by Wolter that the Metropolitan Council pass the attached Resolution 2007authorizing the Council to acquire by negotiation and, if necessary, to file a petition for condemnation of the property interests necessary for the South Saint Paul Forcemain (SSPFM) Improvements– MCES Project 802710.

Motion carried.

2007-156 Authorization to Amend Contract for Regional Assessment of Water Supply Systems

It was moved by Wittsack, seconded by Wolter that the Metropolitan Council authorize its Regional Administrator to amend the contract from the currently authorized amount of \$235,693 to \$403,442 with RW Beck Inc. for a regional assessment of water supply safety security and reliability, project outreach, financial evaluation and development of the master water supply plan.

2007-157 Authorization to Award a Contract for MCES Electrical Maintenance Services

It was moved by Susag, seconded by Wolter that the Metropolitan Council the Regional Administrator to award a contract for MCES Electrical Maintenance Services to Premier Electric for an amount not to exceed \$5,497,096 and a term not to exceed five years.

That the Metropolitan Council its Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute a contract for construction inspection services with Earth Tech in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000.

2007-160 Authorization to Negotiate and Execute Contract for Construction Inspection Services with Howard R. Green

That the Metropolitan Council its Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute a contract for construction inspection services with Howard R. Green in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000.

2007-161 Authorization to Negotiate and Execute Contract for Construction Inspection Services with TKDA

William G. Moore, General Manager, Environmental Services, said that the Council will be acting on Item 2007-130 at its April 25, 2007 meeting, and informed the Committee that from the time when the Committee approved the item on April 10 the cost of the work has increased to \$2.9 million. In addition, scheduling issues could further increase costs.
