### 2007-169 City of East Bethel 2008 Comprehensive Plan Update, Review File No.19744-2

It was moved by Wolter, seconded by Wittsack that the Metropolitan Council approve the City's Tier II Comprehensive Sewer Plan.

### 2007-206 Amendment to 2007-2012 Capital Improvement Program and Capital Program and Budget

It was moved by Susag, seconded by Wittsack that the Metropolitan Council amend the 2007 Authorized Capital Program (multi-year authorization) and the 2007-2012 Capital Improvement Program by adding \$4,000,000 and \$1,600,000, respectively, in authority for the Interceptor Rehabilitation Program, Project No. 8090, and the MWWTP Solids – Odor Control, Centrifuge, and Sludge Storage, Project No. 8061. The Metropolitan Council amends the MCES 2007 Capital Budget (annual appropriation) by increasing it from \$126,700,000 to \$131,600,000.

## 2007-229 Adoption of 2008 Rates and Charges

- Industrial Strength Charge: \$.074 per excess pound of COD (chemical oxygen demand)
- Standard (septage) Load Charge: \$37.61 per thousand gallons,
- Holding Tank Load Charge: \$1.93 per thousand gallons,
- Portable Toilet Waste Load Charge: \$49.91, per thousand gallons,
- Collar County Load Charge: \$47.61 per thousand gallons,
- Strength component of Industrial Load Charge \$.295 per excess pound of TSS,
- Strength component of Industrial Load Charge \$.1475 per excess pound of COD, and
- Industrial Permit Fees as shown on Attachment A.

# **Direct Connection Application Fee**

Dan Schueller, Environmental Services (ES) financial analyst, explained that the direct connection application fee will apply when a request is made to connect directly to an MCES interceptor, and will cover the administrative costs of ES staff. In the event an application is not approved, 50% of the fee is refunded. Staff proposes conducting a public meeting to provide information and gather public input on the proposed fee. The Committee agreed. If adopted, the fee will be effective for all direct connections on and after January 1, 2008.

### **Liability Insurance**

Philip Walljasper, Director of Risk Management and Claims, informed the committee that there have been few claims made against the Council. However, there have been two claims of significance in the last six months that have adversely impacted the Council's renewal premium. Mr. Walljasper informed the Committee that an item will be brought to the Management Committee requesting that the Council authorize self-insuring liability insurance for Environmental Services (ES) up to \$1,000,000 annually. There are sufficient funds available in the ES operating contingency to fund the self-insurance reserve..
