Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorizes its Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute a Construction Cooperation Agreement with the City of Minneapolis for utility relocation and street repair for the Hopkins Force Main improvements.

Background

The Metropolitan Council Environmental Services is reconstructing/rehabilitating the Hopkins force main, MSB 7026 through the communities of Hopkins, St. Louis Park, and Minneapolis. The Metropolitan Council approved the Facility Plan for the Hopkins System Improvements by resolution 2010-03 on February 24, 2010. This project is now in design for the portion within the City of Minneapolis and construction work is expected to begin in spring 2011.

Work to reconstruct or rehabilitate the existing force main within the City of Minneapolis will require replacement of street paving and both temporary removals or relocations of city utilities during the construction. The City of Minneapolis Public Works Department performs much of its water, sewer, and street replacement work with in-house staff. The Public Works Department has requested that certain work involving water mains and street restoration be completed by the City. This work is expected to include engineering, construction, and inspection services.

Rationale

A cooperative agreement will define cost sharing as well as design and construction responsibilities during the force main replacement work. Cooperative agreements require Metropolitan Council authorization.
