Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council ratify the attached Justification for and Declaration of Emergency for flood preparation and protection.

Background

Due to heavy rains in southern Minnesota flood conditions are projected for the Mississippi River, affecting the Metropolitan Plant. The river levels will reach elevations that require the plant to operate several large pumps to remove the treated flow from the plant and discharge to the raised river. Continuous operation of these pumps is critical to ensure the plant doesn't flood. To ensure the pumps continue to operate in the event of a power failure portable generators need to be rented.

Because river levels were originally expected to cover Childs Road, construction of a temporary access road between Warner Road and the top of the influent double barrel interceptor was included in the emergency declaration. Construction of the temporary road was cancelled when it became clear the river levels would not exceed the elevation of the road.

Rationale

Metropolitan Council has delegated authority to the Regional Administrator to declare emergencies on behalf of the Council when the health, safety or welfare of the public is compromised or potentially compromised, and immediate action is required to address the emergency. The emergency declaration is then presented to the appropriate implementation committee for approval, and placed on a following Council consent list for formal ratification.

Funding

Estimated cost for the flood preparation and protection measures is \$130,000.

I REQUEST THAT A PUBLIC EMERGENCY BE DECLARED, BASED UPON THE FOLLOWING:				
Describe the nature of the emergency situation:	Due to heavy rains in the Minnesota and Mississippi river basins it is predicted that the Mississippi river at the Metro Plant will reach levels high enough to require the operation of the plant's effluent pumps and in the likely flooding of the road leading to the plant (Childs Road). The current forecast is the river will reach these high levels by September 26 th and could persist for 2 to 3 weeks.			
Explain why this situation is a present, immediate, and existing emergency:	During high river levels the effluent pumps are necessary to pump the plant's treated effluent out of the plant and "up" to the river. These pumps require electrical power to operate. Should a power outage from the electrical utility occur and the pumps quit operating the waste water entering the plant would have to be diverted to the river to avoid flooding the plant. Renting portable generators to provide backup power is needed to ensure continuous operation of the pumps.			
	Should the river levels start to flood Childs Road access to the plant would be compromised. To ensure vehicles can gain access to the plant a temporary ramp is built at the north end of Childs Road from the Warner Road ramp to the top of the double barrel interceptor. The top of the interceptor is at an elevation above the high river level.			
Explain how this emergency does or will affect the healthy, safety, or welfare of the public or the safety of Metropolitan Council employees or facilities:	If the effluent pumps lose power during high river conditions then untreated waste water would need to be diverted to the river to avoid flooding the plant with the incoming waste water flow. Flooding of the plant would likely result in significant damage to the plant processes and equipment such that even when the river levels recede the plant would be unable to treat waste water efficiently for a significant period of time.			
	Access to the plant is essential for the employees who operate and maintain the plant. Without proper staffing the plant will not operate properly likely resulting in the discharge of poorly treated waste water.
