### Council bills

- Housekeeping (HF 2148)

## Bill Housekeeping

#### M.S.473.157

 Request: Removes statutory requirement that Council compile "target pollution loads"

#### — MPCA:

- Does Total Max Daily Loads (TMDLs) for entire state
- Agrees with this proposal to eliminate duplication

#### M.S.473.519

- Request: Removes requirement for Council to review local government wastewater charging systems
- Local charging systems are local government responsibility and this regulation was part of old EPA grant requirements
  - EPA has not acted on this in decades
  - Retain permissive language only in case EPA requires the review



# **Bill Housekeeping**

#### M.S.473.541

- Request: Removes requirement that Council "shall" levy taxes; replace with "may"
  - All MCES debt service is paid from user fees
  - Note: "may" allows "general obligation" bonding which provides lower interest rates

#### M.S.473.517

- Request: Allows Council to make small loans to cities for wastewater charges when they request
  - Charges to cities are based on measured flow which can vary substantially from year to year
  - Requested by Metro Cities



### **Data Practices**

- Modifies M.S.473.504
- Add subdivision to protect from public disclosure:
  - Security features, building plans, detailed system plans, building specifications for Council's wastewater treatment facilities
  - Also for specifications submitted to Council by third parties in connection with performance of Council's wastewater functions

#### Rationale:

- Security of Council's wastewater treatment facilities and systems is important because:
  - Terrorism vulnerability
  - To keep private information private
- Proposed legislation is modeled after M.S.13.64, subd. 2 for state-owned or state-leased facilities



### **Water Supply**

- Council to carry out water supply planning activities:
  - Gather and maintain technical information
  - Develop Master Water Supply Plan
  - Make recommendations regarding roles, processes and funding
- Metropolitan Area Water Supply Advisory Committee to assist Council
- Council to report to Legislature



# **Committee Membership**

- Commissioners of Agriculture, Health, Natural Resources, Pollution Control Agency or designees
- 1 official from each of the 7 metro counties\*
- Metropolitan Council Chair or designee
- 1 official each from Chisago, Isanti, Sherburne, and Wright Counties\*



### **Need for Extension**

- Slowdown in growth
  - Little water supply system expansion
  - Few water appropriation permits
  - Few modifications to water supply plans
- Lack of information to demonstrate how Master Water Supply Plan affects water supply planning



### **Sunset Language**

- Advisory committee members appointed by the governor
- Members serve without compensation
- Committee expires December 31, 2012 2016
