SAC Work Group Recommendations

Summary

- SAC paid at any time (1973-present) is sufficient evidence in generating potential SAC credits
 - In such cases, <u>net credits</u> can occur that can be used community-wide or left site-specific at community's option
- Look-Back period and vacancy rules would no longer apply



SAC Work Group Recommendations

Summary

- Non-conforming credits (where SAC was not paid) would be available, but limited
 - If community shows either grandparented or continuous demand on a site, those credits will be available to offset SAC charge but only on that site
 - No net credits would be available
- Allowing for minor SAC credit transfers, when determination is 10 or less



SAC Work Group Recommendations

Summary

- MCES to develop SAC loan program specifically to assist communities in helping small businesses whose SAC determination is 10 SAC or less
- Community Reviews limited to review of SAC activity no more than 3 years to date of review initiation
- MCES to provide regular training opportunities for community staff
- MCES is requested to provide alternate language versions of SAC brochure

- Metropolitan Council Website and newsletter
- Letter to City contacts (City Finance, Building, Public Works and Community Development officials), followed by email notice

Public Meeting – October 23

- Chaired by Council Member Gary Van Eyll
- Attended by
 - Council Member Sandy Rummel
 - 32 stakeholders (excluding MCES staff)
- No voiced objections to overall recommendations, but:
 - Request for clarification/change on unused credits from grandparented demand
 - 2) Request to retroactively reinstate net credits missed since 1/1/10 (at least for public properties)
 - 3) Additional unspecified service issues



Outstanding Issues

- Preservation of unused grandparented nonconforming credits
 - Pro: In 1973, communities were told all existing sewered properties would have current capacity reserved for future credit on site; it may be unfair to take away potential credit
 - Pro: Likely only small number of impacted properties (must not have had a determination since 1973)
 - Con: Other people may feel since property has not paid SAC to fund reserve capacity, credit should not continue



Outstanding Issues

- Non-conforming credits (where SAC was not paid) would be available but limited
 - If community shows either grandparented or continuous demand on a site, credits available to offset SAC charge but only on that site
 - No net credits would be available.
 - Net credits would be available
 - Only on site and
 - Only for 5 more years (from determination)
- No other changes proposed
