### **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council:

 Amend the 2012 Authorized Capital Program (multi-year authorization) by adding spending authority as follows:

Metro Transit \$ 37,426,064 Metropolitan Transportation Services \$ 2,059,570

 Amend the 2012 Capital Budget (annual appropriation) by increasing appropriations as follows:

Metro Transit \$ 37,426,064 Metropolitan Transportation Services \$ 2,059,570

Approve the changes to capital projects as detailed in Attachment 1

### Background

This proposed amendment programs regional funding to capital projects in the Transportation Division.

### **Metro Transit**

### Reallocate Authorized Funding:

The proposed amendment transfers \$30,000 in existing spending authority between two projects.

**Decreasing Funding Commitments:** The proposed amendment decreases funding and spending authority by \$222,000 for one project – Rail Associated Capital Maintenance. Federal funding of \$177,000 will transferred to the 2012 Operating Budget to paint rail cares for

preventive maintenance. Regional funding of \$44,000 will be available to fund future capital projects.

#### **Increasing Funding Commitments:**

The proposed amendment increases funding and spending authority by a total of \$37,648,064 on twenty-six projects. Funding for the new authorizations includes \$26,705,518 in federal funding, \$10,892,546 in regional funding and \$50,000 in Dakota County funding.

Twenty-two of the projects were in the adopted 2012-2017 capital improvement program and are being moved from future to authorized status. Four of the projects are new projects not previously identified in the Capital Improvement Program. They include:

- LRT Interchange Facilities, funded with \$50,000 in regional funding,
- The Interchange Project, funded with \$10,000,000 in competitively-awarded federal TIGER III funds,
- Downtown Minneapolis State Area Improvements, funded with \$100,000 in regional funding, and
- Cedar Avenue BRT, funded with \$50,000 in regional funding.

**Net Change in Authorization:** \$37,426,064

**Net Change to Current Year Budget:** Based on the timing of projected expenditures for the proposed amendments, the 2012 Capital Budget is proposed to increase by \$37,426,064.

#### **Metropolitan Transportation Services**

**Increasing Funding Commitments:** The proposed amendment increases funding and spending authority by a total of \$2,059,570 on fourteen projects. Substitution of federal funding for regional funding results in \$8,620,160 in new federal funding and a reduction in regional funding of \$6,560,590.

All of the projects were in the adopted 2012-2017 capital improvement program and are being moved from future to authorized status.

**Net Change in Authorizations:** \$2,059,570

**Net Change to Current Year Budget:** Based on the timing of projected expenditures for the proposed amendments, the 2012 Capital Budget is proposed to increase by \$2,059,570.

#### Rationale

This proposed amendment programs regional funds and increases multi-year spending authority. These capital projects will allow the Council to carry out its long-term capital improvement program for transit.

### **Fiscal Impact**

The proposed amendment increases Council regional bonding for Metro Transit projects by \$10.89 million. There is available, un-programmed regional bonding authority provided by the Legislature to accommodate the additional bonding for Metro Transit.

The proposed amendment reduces regional bonding by \$6.56 million for Metropolitan Transportation Services (MTS) capital projects.
