Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council:

• Amend the 2012 Authorized Capital Program (multi-year authorization) by adding spending authority as follows:

Parks and Open Space	
Closed Projects Removed from Capital Program	(\$ 21,477,713)
New Authorizations	<u>\$ 26,749,000</u>
Net Change in Authorizations	\$ 5,271,287

• Amend the 2012 Capital Budget (annual appropriation) by increasing appropriations as follows:

Parks and Open Space \$ 4,436,800

• Approve the changes to capital projects as detailed in Attachment 1

Background

This proposed amendment programs regional funding to capital projects in the Community Development Division.

Parks and Open Space

Reallocate Authorized Funding:

The proposed amendment transfers \$33,000 from two Anoka County projects into a third project. The proposed amendment also allocates \$3,262,958 in authority from the Parks and Trails and Environmental Trust Fund Accounts to six land acquisition opportunity grants previously approved by the Council.

Decreasing Funding Commitments:

The proposed amendment removes 25 capital projects that have been completed and closed from the authorized capital program, totaling \$21,477,713 in authority.

Increasing Funding Commitments:

The proposed amendment increases funding and spending authority by a total of \$26,749,000, including:

- \$1,469,000 for one new project funded with SFY 2011 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund funding;
- \$14,400,000 for 29 new projects funded with SFY 2012 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund funding;
- \$6,315,000 for 17 new projects funded with \$3,726,000 in SFY 2012 state bonds and \$2,589,000 in regional funding;
- \$2,690,000 in new authority for the Parks and Trails Legacy Fund Land Acquisition Opportunity Fund Account, funded with \$1,614,000 in state funds and \$1,076,000 in regional funds.
- \$1,875,000 in new authority for the Environmental Trust Fund Land Acquisition Opportunity Fund Account, funded with \$1,125,000 in state funds and \$750,000 in regional funds.

Funding for the new projects includes \$22,334,000 in state funds and \$4,415,000 in regional funds. All of the projects were in the adopted 2012-2017 Capital Improvement Program and are being moved from future to authorized status.

Net Change in Authorizations: \$ 5,271,287

Net Change to Current Year Budget: Based on the timing of projected expenditures for the proposed amendments, the 2012 Capital Budget is proposed to increase by \$4,436,800.

Rationale

This proposed amendment programs regional funds and increases multi-year spending authority. These capital projects will allow the Council to carry out its long-term capital improvement program for transit and parks.

Fiscal Impact

The proposed amendment increasing regional funding in the Authorized Capital Program by \$4,415,000. The level of regional funding was reflected in the adopted 2012-2017 Capital Improvement Plan and related fiscal analysis.

Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council:

Amend the 2012 Capital Budget (annual appropriation) by increasing it \$4,436,800 for the year 2012 and increasing the multi-year authorization by \$5,271,287 for Parks and Open Space;

Approve the projects under "Increasing Funding Commitments" as detailed in Attachment 1.

Background

The proposed capital program and budget amendment includes the following changes to the adopted Parks and Open Space capital program:

Reducing Funding Commitments:

Twenty-five grants (25) are completed that totaled \$21,477,713 which reduces the multi-year authorization by that amount. These grants are depicted on Attachment 1 under the heading "Grants that were completed and closed out."

Five (5) Land Acquisition Opportunity Fund grants were approved since the last capital budget amendment that totaled \$3,262,958. This reduced the amount available for future grants as depicted in Attachment 1 under the heading "Reducing Funding Commitments for Land Acquisition Opportunity Fund Grants". The previously approved grants are shown in Attachment 1 under the heading "Subtotal Combined Parks and Trails Legacy Fund Acquisition and Environmental Trust Fund Acquisition Account"

Reallocation Among Existing Grants:

Three (3) grants to Anoka County are amended by reallocating \$33,000 from two grants into a third grant as depicted in Attachment 1 under the heading "Reallocation Among Existing Grants"

Increasing Funding Commitments:

The amendment authorizes a \$1,469,000 grant to the Minneapolis Park Board from its share of the State Fiscal Year 2012 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation. The grant is for land acquisition that is consistent with the amended park master plan boundary for Above the Falls Regional Park. It's depicted in Attachment 1 under the heading "New Grant for FY 2012 Parks & Trails Legacy Fund Project Specific CIP."

The amendment authorizes 29 new project grants financed with \$14.4 million of the State Fiscal Year 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation [2011 Minnesota First Special Session Laws, Chapter 6, Article 3, Section. 40]. The project grants are shown in Attachment 1 under the heading "New Legislative Authorization FY 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund Project Specific CIP".

The amendment authorizes 17 new project grants financed with \$3,726,000 of 2012 State bonds to the Metropolitan Council for regional park and trail grants consistent with the Council's project specific regional parks capital improvement program. [2012 Minnesota Laws, Chapter 293, Section 17, Subd. 2] The bond appropriation is matched with \$2,589,000 of Metropolitan Council bonds. These grants are shown in Attachment 1 under the heading "New Legislative Authorization 2012 State Bond and Metro Council Bond Project Specific CIP."

The amendment adds \$1,614,000 of FY 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation with \$1,076,000 of Metropolitan Council bonds and \$1,125,000 of FY 2013 Environmental Trust Fund appropriation with \$750,000 of Metropolitan Council bonds for future Park Acquisition Opportunity Fund grants as depicted in Attachment 1 under the heading "New Land Acquisition Opportunity Fund Grant Revenue."

Change in Current Year Expenditures:

Based on projected expenditures for the proposed amendment in the remainder of 2012, the 2012 Capital Budget is proposed to be increased by \$4,436,800.

The Multi-Year Authorization is decreased by \$5,271,287 based on the net results of deducting reduced funding commitments from increased funding commitments.

Rationale

This amendment to the 2012 Authorized Capital Program implements a portion of the State FY 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation and 2012 State bonds and matching Metro Council bonds appropriated for specific projects.

Funding

This amendment is financed with a portion of the State FY 2013 Parks and Trails Fund appropriation, and a portion of the 2012 State bond appropriation with matching Metropolitan Council bonds as described above and in Attachment 1.

Known Support / Opposition

The regional park implementing agencies which receive these subgrants support this amendment. The grants are consistent with legislative and Metropolitan Council policies/requirements.
