SUBJECT: 2008-13 Regional Parks CIP as part of Metropolitan Council's Unified 2008-13 CIP

INTRODUCTION

In response to a request from the September MPOSC meeting, this memorandum provides a briefing on the 2008-13 Regional Parks Capital Improvement Program (CIP) as part of the Metropolitan Council's Unified 2008-13 CIP. It includes prioritized project lists from each park agency in compliance with the Commission's recommendations and Council action on structuring the regional parks CIP in May and June 2007.

AUTHORITY TO REVIEW

MN Statute 473.147, Subdivision 1 requires the Metropolitan Council, after consultation with the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission, municipalities, park districts and counties in the metropolitan area to prepare and adopt a system policy plan for regional recreation open space as part of the Council's development guide. The law also requires the Council to include a five year capital improvement program (CIP) in the parks policy plan, which should be revised periodically, and to establish criteria and priorities for the allocation of funds from the capital improvement program.

BACKGROUND

On June 13, 2007 the Metropolitan Council approved the following recommendations regarding the 2008-13 Regional Parks CIP:

- 1. That the Metropolitan Council prepare a 2008-13 regional parks CIP that divides the amount proposed for each regional park agency by weighting the most recent population data for that park agency by 70% and by weighting the percentage of non-local visits that agency hosted from the 1998-99 parks visitor study by 30% as shown on Table 1.
- 2. That the regional park agencies submit a prioritized list of funding requests for projects for the 2008-13 parks CIP within the amount proposed for that agency as determined by the formula in recommendation 1 and shown on Table 1. Funding requests for projects from each agency's prioritized list must be consistent with Metropolitan Council approved master plans, and in the case of reimbursement requests the Council must have approved consideration of the reimbursement in a former action of the Council. If those funding requests for projects are not consistent with a Council approved master plan or past Council action on a reimbursement, the Council will return the list to the agency for resubmittal of a new list.

- 3. That appropriations of State funds and matching Metropolitan Council bonds for the 2008-13 parks CIP be granted among the park agencies as determined from the formula in recommendation 1 and shown on Table 1, and that the agencies be required to spend the grants on the Council approved prioritized list of CIP projects. If the CIP funding request is not fully funded the park agency must spend its grant on projects in priority order of the CIP list of projects for that agency.
- 4. That the 2008-09 portion of the CIP is based on the issuance of up to \$7 million of Metropolitan Council bonds to provide a 40% match to a 2008 State bond request of \$10.5 million. This results in a 2008-09 CIP total of \$17.5 million. And that Council staff receive prioritized funding requests from each park agency consistent with the amount shown for that agency in Table 1 by June 18 in order that a preliminary 2008 State bonding request of \$10.5 million can be prepared and submitted to the Minnesota Dept. of Finance by June 25. For planning purposes, a \$10.5 million State bond request matched with \$7 million of Council bonds for the 2010-11 and 2012-13 biennium's should also be submitted on June 25. The Metropolitan Council and park agencies may revise the park agency prioritized lists within the amounts shown on Table 1 via formal review and approval such that a final bonding request composed of Council-approved projects is submitted to the Minnesota Dept. of Finance by October 10.

Submission of 2008 State bond request to partially finance 2008-09 Regional Parks CIP

In compliance with the Council's approved actions, shortly before June 25 Council staff submitted a preliminary State bonding request of \$10.5 million to match \$7 million to finance the 2008-09 portion of the 2008-13 regional parks CIP. It contained a preliminary list of prioritized projects submitted by each park implementing agency. The funding requests from each agency were reviewed for compliance with applicable Council policies—specifically that the projects proposed for funding were consistent with Council approved master plans, and in the cases of reimbursement requests, that the Council had approved consideration of the reimbursement for the CIP. Park agencies were allowed to modify their list as long as the revisions were also consistent with the aforementioned policies.

On August 15, final funding requests from each park agency were submitted to the Council. The 2008-09 portion of the CIP is incorporated into the Council's final State bond request of \$10.5 million which will be submitted to the MN Dept. of Finance on or before October 10. Following is a draft of that final State bond request.

Project At A Glance

\$10.5 M is requested to match \$7 million of Metropolitan Council bonds to improve and expand the Metropolitan Regional Park System.

Project Description

The Metropolitan Regional Park System consists of 52,000 acres of parks and 172 miles of trails. The Metropolitan Regional Park System is owned, operated, and maintained by ten regional park implementing agencies:

Anoka County Ramsey County
City of Bloomington City of St. Paul
Carver County Scott County

Dakota County Three Rivers Park District Minneapolis Park & Rec. Bd. Washington County

This final request is based on distributing the State and Metropolitan Council bonds as subgrants to regional park implementing agencies for each park agency's prioritized list of capital projects that have been approved by the Metropolitan Council in the Council's 2008-09 portion of the 2008-13 Metropolitan Regional Parks Capital Improvement Program (CIP).

The Metropolitan Council, with the advice of the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission, prepares a Metropolitan Regional Parks CIP under direction from MS 473.147. This request is to fund a portion of that CIP. The following table illustrates the amount of each park agency's subgrant in the CIP as part of this State bond request.

The percentage share of the total request (combined State bonds and matching Metro Council bonds) for each park agency is shown on the following table. The agency share is based on the agency's 2005 population, which was given a weight of 70%; and the percentage of non-local visits that park agency's regional park/trail units received in a 1998-99 park visitor study, which was given a weight of 30%. If less than \$10.5 million is appropriated, each park agency will receive its percentage share of the State bond appropriation and Metro Council bond match as shown on the following table. For example, 10.8% of the combined appropriated State bonds and Metro Council bond match would be granted to Anoka County. The park agency must spend its share on funding projects in priority order of its prioritized project list, which is attached at the end of this narrative.

Over 33 million visits occurred in the Metropolitan Regional Park System in 2006. Of this amount, 40.0% or 13.2 million visits were from persons living out-of-state, from Greater Minnesota, and from the Metropolitan Area outside the park implementing agency's local jurisdiction. The state bond request is matched with Metropolitan Council bonds on a 60% state/40% Metropolitan Council basis. This fairly spreads the costs of these capital improvements between all state taxpayers relative to their use of the park

system and what they pay in taxes for debt service on the State bonds and Council bonds.

The final list of projects in priority order for each park implementing agency that would be funded from the State bond request and the Metropolitan Council bond match is shown at the end of this narrative. This final list is changed from the preliminary request submitted in June. The projects are consistent with Council-approved park or trail master plans.

Metropolitan Regional Park System as part of State's Strategic Mission

The Metropolitan Regional Park System is one of four regional systems the Metropolitan Council is charged to plan and develop capital improvement programs under State law (MS 473.147). Since 1974, the State of Minnesota has provided \$278.5 million in capital funds (bonds and Environmental Trust Funds as recommended by the Legislative Citizens Commission on Minnesota Resources (LCCMR) and its predecessor.

Impact on Agency Operating Budgets (Facilities Notes)

There is no direct impact on state agency operating budgets since the State of Minnesota does not operate Metropolitan Regional Park System units. However, indirectly, the state's capital investment in the Metropolitan Regional Park System reduces the visitor impact on three state parks, one state recreation area and two state trails in the Metropolitan region. The reduced visitor pressure on the State park/trail units reduces the costs to operate and maintain those parks.

Previous Appropriations for this Project

The State has appropriated \$243.2 million of bonds to the Metropolitan Council for this program from 1974 to 2007. In 2006, \$29.9 million was appropriated including \$7 million for the 2006-07 Metropolitan Regional Parks CIP projects, plus \$22.9 million of line item appropriations for projects in addition to the projects in the 2006-07 Parks CIP. The Council provided \$4.6 million of bonds as a 40% match to the \$7 million of State bonds appropriated for the 2006-07 Parks CIP projects.

The State has provided \$35.2 million of Environmental Trust Fund appropriations from 1991 to 2007 as recommended by the Legislative Commission on Minnesota Resources-now the Legislative Citizens Commission on Minnesota Resources (LCCMR). In 2007 the LCCMR recommended a \$2.5 million appropriation to be used to partially finance land acquisition projects to supplement what is appropriated for land acquisition in the 2006-07 Parks CIP. The Council provided a \$1.33 million match to the LCCMR recommended funding.

Other Considerations

The LCCMR and its predecessor the Legislative Commission on Minnesota Resources have recommended funds to supplement the State bond

appropriations for the Parks CIP. As noted above, the most recent appropriation of \$2.5 million in 2007 was targeted to land acquisition projects.
