SUBJECT: (2012-156) Summary of Parks Portion of 2012 Unified Capital Budget

Amendment

INTRODUCTION

In June the Metropolitan Council will consider an amendment to the 2012 Unified Capital Budget that includes:

- 1. Park grants financed from the 2012 State bond appropriation and matching Metro Council bonds (See Table 1)
- 2. Park grants financed from the FY 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation (See Table 2)
- 3. Amended grant amounts to Anoka County financed with the FY 2012 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation described in "(2012-xxx) Amend Four Fiscal Year 2012 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund grants to Anoka County." Also a new grant to the Minneapolis Park & Rec. Board financed from its share of the FY 2012 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation to finance a portion of the costs to acquire the Scherer Lumber Co. parcel for Above the Falls Regional Park described in "(2012-xxx) Master plan amendment of boundary for Above the Falls Regional Park and approval of FY 2012 and FY 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund financed grants, Minneapolis Park & Recreation Board." (See Table 3)

This memorandum contains all of these grants for the Commission's information and recommendation that they be approved because they are consistent with applicable State laws governing those appropriations as well as the parks portion of the Council's adopted 2012-17 Unified Capital Improvement Program.

AUTHORITY TO REVIEW

Minnesota Statute Section 473.315 authorizes the "Metropolitan Council with the advice of the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission to make grants from any funds available to it for recreation open space purposes to any municipality, park district or county located wholly or partially within the metropolitan area to cover the cost, or any portion of the cost, of acquiring or developing regional recreation open space in accordance with the [Regional Recreation Open Space] Policy Plan".

<u>Grants financed with 2012 State bond appropriation and matching Metro Council bonds.</u>

Table 1 lists the grants that would be financed with a 2012 State bond appropriation of \$4,586,000 and \$3,057,000 of Metropolitan Council bonds. The amount allocated to each regional park agency is consistent with its percentage share of the 2012-13 regional parks capital improvement in which 70% is based on the proportional share of the region's population of each of the 10 regional park agencies and 30% based on the proportional share of the non-local visits each park agency hosts.

The population in areas where park agency jurisdictions overlap are adjusted as follows:

- -Ramsey County's population excludes the City of St. Paul's population
- -Three Rivers Park District's population is the population of suburban Hennepin County excluding the City of Bloomington.

The non-local visits share is based on the share of visits each park agency hosts of total non-local visits. A non-local visit is a visit by a person who lives outside the jurisdiction of the park agency hosting that visitor. For example, an Anoka County resident who visits a City of St. Paul regional park is a non-local visitor. A suburban Ramsey County resident who visits a City of St. Paul regional park is a non-local visitor and likewise, a City of St. Paul resident who visits a Ramsey County regional park is a non-local visitor.

A grant of \$1,130,000 to Three Rivers Park District is shown as a placeholder as part of the District's allocation. At this time, the Park District Board has not decided how to spend that portion of the appropriation. A separate action to approve that grant will occur in a future amendment to the Metro Council's Unified Capital Budget.

Grants financed with FY 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation

Table 2 lists the grants that are financed with the FY 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation. The appropriation is disbursed to the regional park agencies based on a formula in Minn. Statute Section 85.53, Subd. 3. Here is a summary of the formula:

35% based on share of most recent population data for park agency's jurisdiction

20% based on share of annual total visits each park agency hosts

20% based on share of previous year's operations and maintenance expenditures by each park agency

15% based on share of annual non-local visits each park agency hosts

10% based on share of regional park and trail acreage managed by each agency. For park reserves, 80% of those unit's acres are divided by four to make them comparable to regional parks.

A grant of \$125,000 to Dakota County for developing the Lake Marion Regional Trail is a placeholder in the table because the Metro Council has not yet received and approved a master plan for that trail. A separate action to approve that grant will occur in a future amendment to the Metro Council's Unified Capital Budget after the Council has approved that trail's master plan.

Grants financed with FY 2012 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriations

Table 3 lists three grants to Anoka County financed with FY 2012 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriations in which the grant amounts are changed to reflect Anoka County's request as described in agenda item titled "(2012-xxx) Amend Four Fiscal Year 2012 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund grants to Anoka County".

This table also includes the grant to the Minneapolis Park & Rec. Board to finance a portion of the Scherer Lumber Co. parcel that is within the amended boundary for Above the Falls Regional Park as described in the agenda item titled "(2012-xxx) Master plan amendment of boundary for Above the Falls Regional Park and approval of FY 2012 and FY 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund financed grants, Minneapolis Park & Recreation Board."

CONCLUSIONS

- 1. The regional park grants listed in Tables 1 to 3 with the exception of grant placeholders are consistent with applicable Metropolitan Council policy and state law for distributing these funds among the regional park implementing agencies.
- 2. The grants must be included in an amendment to the Metro Council's 2012 Unified Capital Budget as part of the Council's authorization process for the grants.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Metropolitan Council approve the regional park grants listed in Tables 1 to 3 with the exception of grant placeholders as part of the Metropolitan Council's 2nd Quarter Unified Capital Budget Amendment.
