Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council concur with the Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) action to amend the 2009-2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include three ADA compliance upgrade projects.

Background

The projects will provide ADA-compliant curb ramps, sidewalks and pedestrian crossing equipment in three specific trunk highways in Minneapolis and St. Paul, plus various locations metrowide. These projects were solicited statewide and scored by a committee that included members of the ADA community.

Rationale

The projects must be in the current TIP in order to use the federal transportation funds allocated for its construction.

Funding

These projects are funded with MN/DOT's share of transportation infrastructure funds in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA).



SUBJECT: 2009-2012 TIP Amendment: MN/DOT: Three ADA Upgrades.

MOTION: The TAB amended the 2009-2012 TIP to include three ADA compliance upgrade projects on MN/DOT roads totaling \$2.0 million in MN/DOT ARRA funds.

BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE OF ACTION: \$2 million of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds, along with \$2.5 million in State funds, were directed toward projects that will accomplish the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). MN/DOT solicited MN/DOT District Offices for projects that would meet a set of criteria and could be delivered by November 13, 2009. These submittals were scored and prioritized list of projects were recommended for funding. Three of these projects were Metro District projects costing a total of \$2 million.

PROJECT BACKGROUND:

1. Briefly describe why amendment is needed (e.g., project in previous STIP but not completed; illustrative project and funds now available; discretionary funds received; inadvertently not included in STIP).

President Obama signed the \$787 billion American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) into law on Tuesday, February 17, 2009. This bill included increased funding for infrastructure across the country. Minnesota received approximately \$500 million for highway projects. \$2 million of the ARRA funds, along with \$2.5 million of State funds, were directed toward projects that will accomplish Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements.

In order to select projects for funding, MnDOT Office of Investment Management solicited the MnDOT District Offices for projects that would meet a set of criteria and could be delivered by November 13, 2009. All districts submitted approximately \$10.5 million in potential projects. These were scored by a committee, including the ADA community, and a prioritized list of projects were recommended for funding. Metro District submitted 5 projects and 3 were selected for a total of \$2,000,000.
